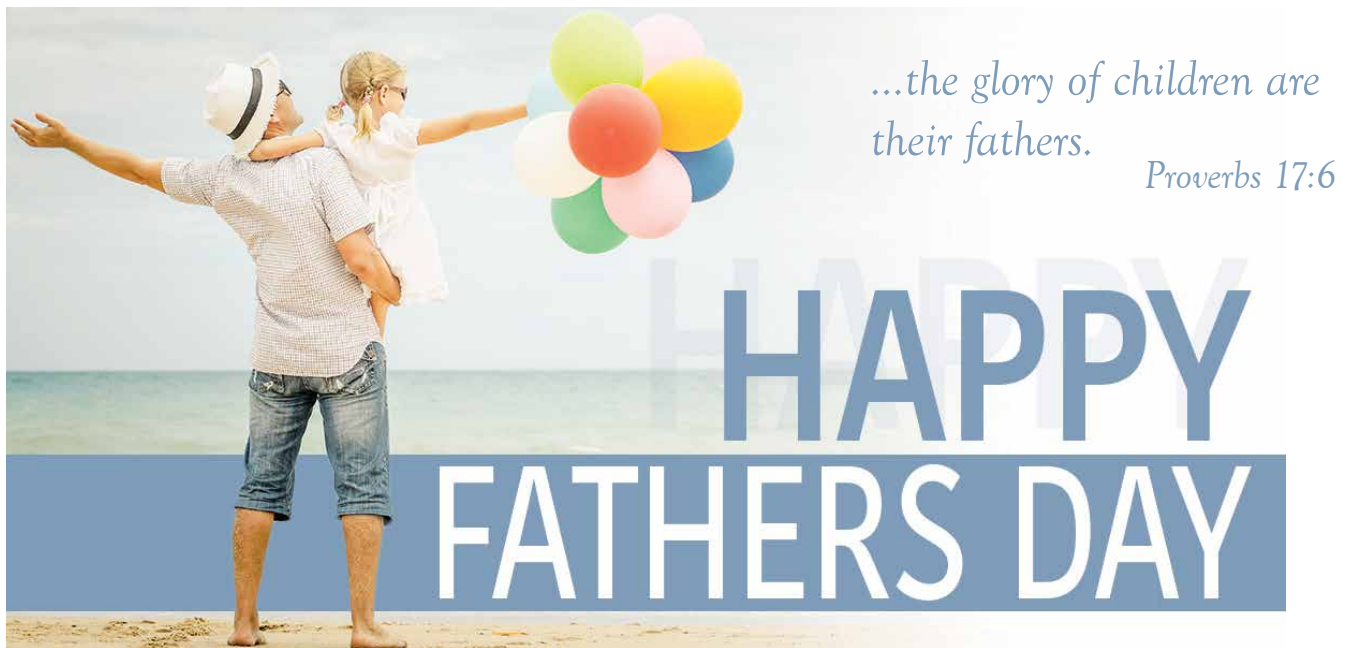
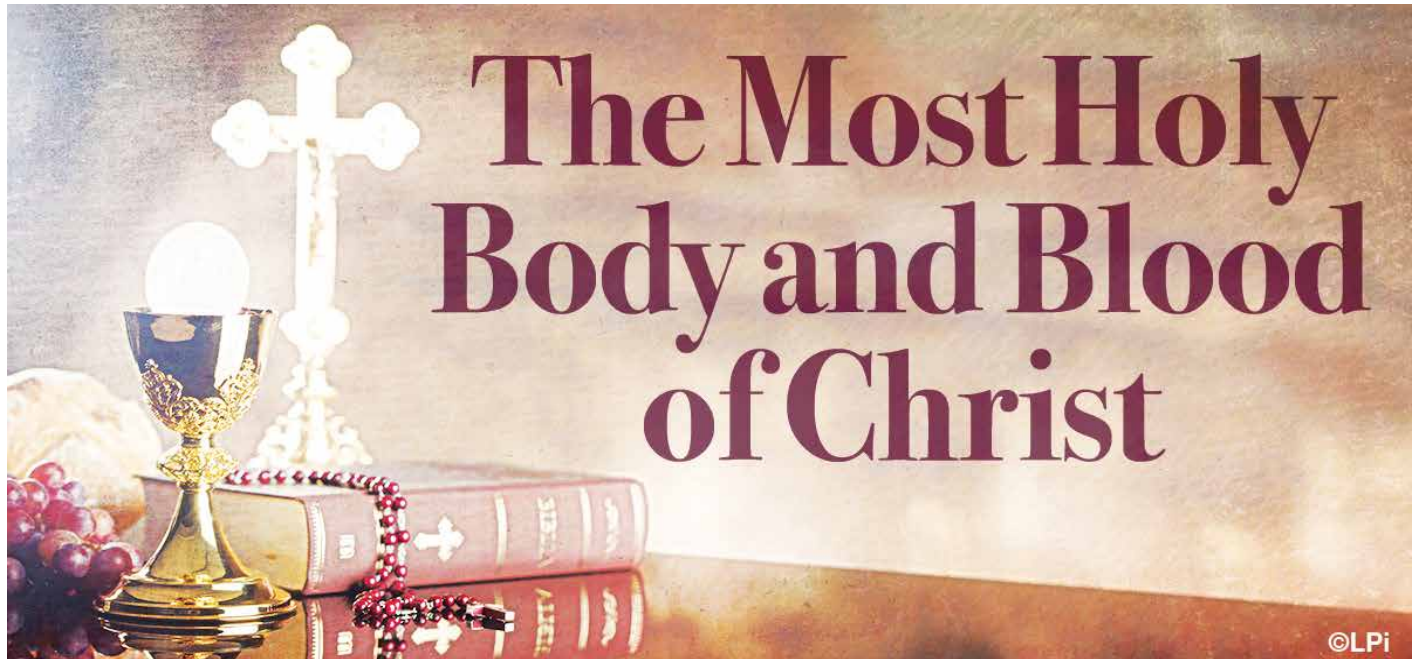

Baptism of Infants and Children

Parents who wish to have their child baptized should contact the Parish Office at 262-367-0800. The first step is to review the requirements of baptism and register online (stcharleshartland.com) for a required baptismal preparation session which is held every other month. Parents will then contact Beth Thompson at 262-367-6704 to schedule a date for their child's baptism. Baptisms are celebrated at St. Charles on Sundays of every month except during Lent and Advent.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)

If you are considering becoming Catholic or were baptized in the Catholic Church but were not raised in the faith and did not receive First Eucharist, we invite you to consider beginning the process of initiation (RCIA) into the church. Please call the Parish Office at 262-367-0800.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

"The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?'" From the beginning, the Eucharist has been a source of controversy. Some people have always found the teaching difficult to accept. But as Catholics, the Blessed Sacrament is at the heart of our worship and our spirituality; we go to Mass to share in the holy sacrifice of Jesus' body and blood, and we receive spiritual nourishment from partaking of this heavenly food. As Jesus himself tells us in today's Gospel, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."

From this passage it is clear that Jesus intended the Eucharist to be a tremendous gift for us. This of course is because the bread is Christ's "flesh for the life of the world." In other words, just as he gave his body on the cross to save us from our sins, so too this same flesh is given for us at every Mass to strengthen our weakness and unite us more deeply to our Savior.

Receiving Communion isn't like taking a magic pill. We must beware of reducing this sacrament to an empty ritual or a foolproof guarantee of heaven. No, it is quite possible to receive Communion unworthily and reject its spiritual efficacy. Just like the benefits of a healthy meal can be undone by a habit of binging on junk food, so too we can prevent Holy Communion from having its full benefits when we crowd our souls with vices and sins. If, on the other hand, we wish to let this sacrament of divine grace flourish, we should receive it with a sincere spirit of gratitude and reverence, praying that we may be made worthy to receive such a gift.

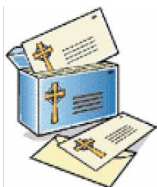

St. Charles New "Buddy Benches"

Thanks to a fast-paced Eagle Scout and a generous family, St. Charles Parish School students will never be lonely.

Two new "Buddy Benches" were recently installed and they offer students a chance to make new friends. The two yellow benches are near the playground and the Gaga Pit.

Luke Clendenning, a St. Charles alum and Arrowhead High School senior, built the benches in the last six months for his Eagle Scout service project – from original concept to final outcome. The words St. Charles Buddy Bench are painted on each.

One Buddy Bench is in memory of Jessica Louise Bonewell, a former parishioner, who passed away in 2015. Jessica was a preschool teacher whose love for children was evident. Her family initiated the effort to bring a Buddy Bench to St. Charles so that children could signal to other kids that they were feeling lonely or sad.

The idea behind the Buddy Bench is that someone sits on the bench when he or she has no one to play with and he or she is feeling low. Other students then stop what they are doing and go to the bench and invite that person to play. The Buddy Bench is for children only and it is never to be used for a time out.

Deacon Allen Olson, the school's middle school religion teacher, recently blessed the benches.

Luke also built two other benches for St. Charles. One is located at the main school entrance and the other sits outside the Tot Lot Playground on Renson Road.

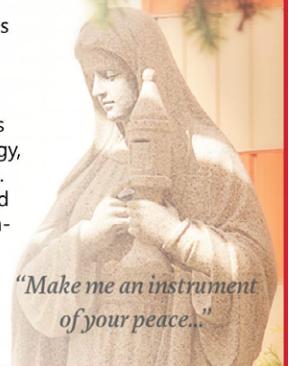
St. Charles After School Care Teacher Needed!
