ASK (3 Minutes)

- Begin in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit
- Take a moment to be still, rest and know that Jesus is here...
- Ask Jesus to help you get to know Him during this prayer time.
- Say, “Lord, teach me to pray.”

SEEK (7 Minutes)

- After reading the day’s scripture, take some time to reflect in silence on one or more of the following questions:
 - What word or phrases in this passage caught your attention?
 - What in this passage comforted you?
 - What in this passage challenged you?
- Re-read the passage.
- Take a few minutes to simply listen and then respond with: “I hear the Lord saying to me ...”

KNOCK (5 Minutes)

- Based on what you hear the Lord saying to you, now ask Him what He wants you to do today or this week in light of his Will for you.
- Listen to His answer to you and then respond by saying, “I believe the Lord wants me to ...”
- Ask the Lord for what you need to respond to His word. Thank Him for being with you today.
- Close with an Our Father. End in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

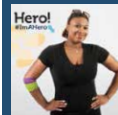

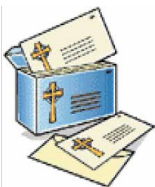

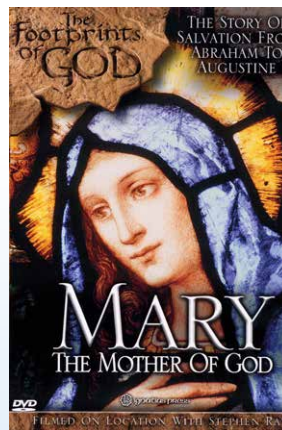


Register Now for the 2017 Women of Christ Conference

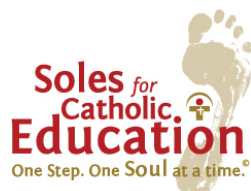
