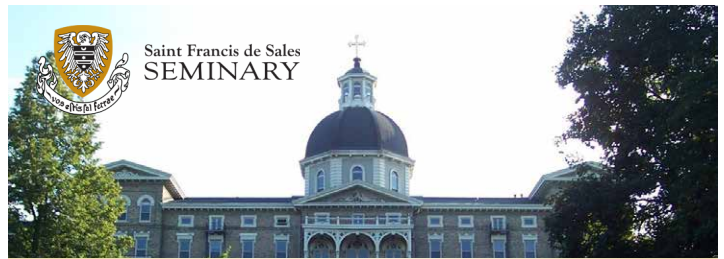
Ballpark Day of Faith Searching for 'Parish Ambassadors'
