Gospel Reflection

Have you ever wanted to be part of something bigger? Even the most independent among us likes to make changes and have an impact on others. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus demonstrates one of his most iconic miracles - the multiplication of the loaves. It is a sign of the institution of the Eucharist, when we are fed not by bread but by the Body of Christ.

In the stories of ancient pagan gods, mighty deeds were done entirely under the gods' own power. Mortals may have offered sacrifices to start the chain of events, but they played little role in the miraculous works themselves. Jesus is entirely different. The multiplication of the loaves is a prime example not only of Jesus' power over nature, but of the way he equips his disciples.

In the sacraments, God works through simple matter to make grace real in our lives. He works in and through us as well. Are you facing problems that could have spiritual solutions? Is there a need in your parish or community that you could meet? Whatever our hesitations, Jesus honors our simple loaves and fishes. He invites us to participate in his generous work of redemption, just as we are.

The Opportunity To Receive A Plenary Indulgence

On Thursday, Aug. 2nd, every Catholic has the opportunity to receive a plenary indulgence either for himself or herself or for a soul in purgatory when he or she:

- Visits his or her parish church and prays the Our Father and the Creed;
- Prays for the intentions proposed by the Pope Francis;
- Goes to confession within twenty days before or after Aug. 2nd;
- Receiving Holy Communion within twenty days before or after Aug. 2nd;
- Is free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin.

This indulgence, which confers the remission of all time in purgatory, is granted each year in memory of the little chapel, called the Portiuncula, which St. Francis of Assisi rebuilt and where he founded the Franciscan Order in the early 13th century.

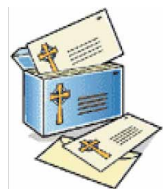

Hello St. Charles Parishioners,

My name is Deacon Allen Olson and I was the middle school Religion and K-8 Music teacher at St. Charles School and currently am Deacon and Pastoral Associate at St. Teresa of Calcutta Church in North Lake. Every December, parishioner Jacyntha Shaw and I go out to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota, the poorest Indian Reservation in the United States, and visit Red Cloud Catholic School which has wonderful connections with the Marquette Jesuits.

Through last years generous donations by St. Charles parishioners, we were able to give each teacher kindergarten through 8th Grade a box of teaching supplies and each student a bag full of school supplies such as pens, pencils, paper, crayons/markers, pencil box, etc. We also give each K-4th grade student a small stuffed animal as a gift. For many this will be the only gift they receive at Christmas time. We delivered new clothing for Sacred Heart (which is like St. Vincent de Paul) that residents may purchase at extremely low prices. Your generous donations also supplied another nearby Catholic school on the reservation, Our Lady of Lourdes, with the same amount of supplies as Red Cloud School.

This year I again humbly ask that as you purchase school supplies for your children you also purchase an item for Red Cloud School students. There will be large totes at the back of church where you or your child may drop off the school items. Thank you very much for your continued generosity!
