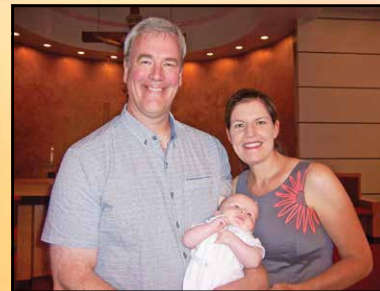

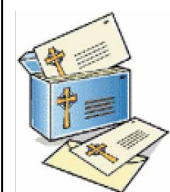
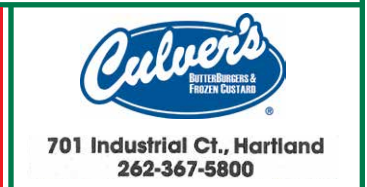

Mass of Sister Thea
Bowman

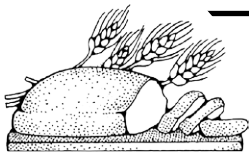
Sister Thea Bowman, F.S.P.A. was a nationally known orator, singer, preacher and evangelist until her death in 1990 at the age of 52. She was born into a Methodist family in Yazoo City, Mississippi in 1937 and grew up in nearby Canton. With her parents' permission she joined the Catholic Church when she was nine years old. She decided to join the

Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration as a teen and was the only African American woman to join that order. After taking vows, her religious order sent her on to earn master's and doctorate degrees in English literature and linguistics at Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

Sister Thea taught in parochial schools and at Viterbo University in La Crosse, WI. Her ministry grew and attracted national attention. Soon she was in demand to speak to congregations of all races, including the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Fr. Maurice Nutt is currently leading the Cause for Canonization of Sister Thea.

While I did not know her personally (she died when I was young), my parents knew her and I grew up hearing so many amazing stories about her faith-filled presence, singing and teaching. During the 2014-2015 academic year, I served on the faculty at Viterbo University where she was a student and later a professor. She has inspired me in so many ways, and it was an privilege for me to write this Mass setting in her honor. We will use the "Mass of Sister Thea Bowman" musical Mass setting for this month which is located in the green section of the worship aid. The Mass setting is comprised of five pieces of music (Gloria, the Holy Holy, the Memorial Acclamation, the Great Amen and the Lamb of God.) I am thrilled to share this music with the congregation at St. Charles, and I hope that it inspires you to find out more about Sister Thea's legacy.

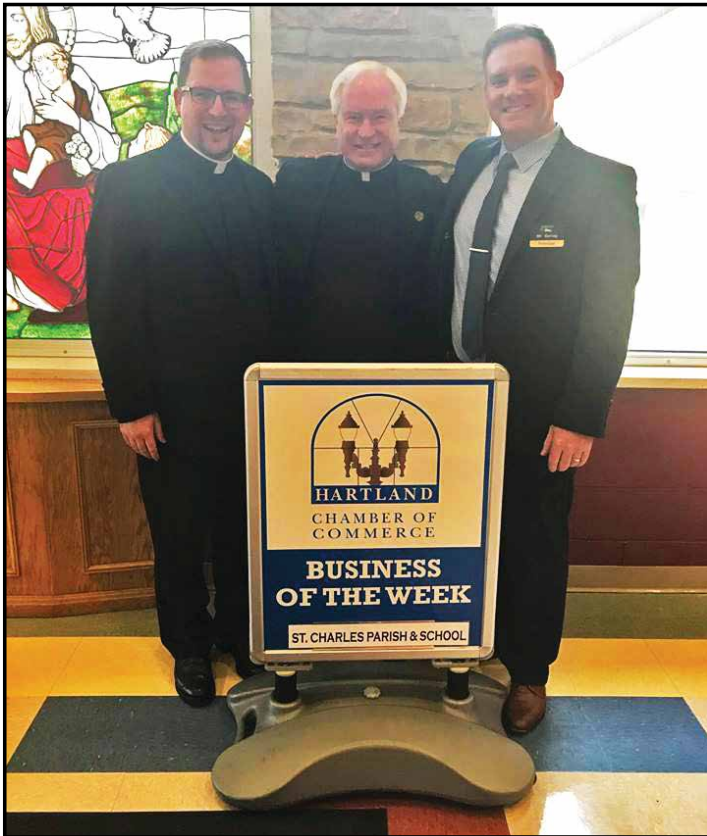

ST. VINCENT de PAUL SOCIETY



The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, founded in 1833 by Blessed Frederic Ozanam, is an international Catholic charitable lay organization whose members grow spiritually through person-person service to those in need. Its members are united in a spirit of charity to help the poor, lonely and suffering people in their community. They strive to bring the love and hope of Christ to those who suffer, believing that each person bears the face of Christ. Many know of SVdP through its thrift stores whose profits are used to support the many programs offered by the society. SVdP stores are open to everyone regardless of income, however, the poor who seek assistance are often able to obtain clothing, furniture and other household goods at the retail stores at no cost due to the kindness of donors.

In addition to the stores, the Society feeds the hungry through meal programs, food pantries and summer lunch programs. Through donations to SVdP, conferences provide financial assistance for families in danger of eviction, in need of security deposits, automobile repairs, utility payments, medical bills and other financial needs. Belief in providing a hand to change lives, SVdP also provides mentoring programs to educate patrons with budgeting and financial awareness. If you are interested in contributing to our mission, SVdP collection boxes are located in the narthex and next to the sign-up shelf. Thank you for your prayers and generosity.

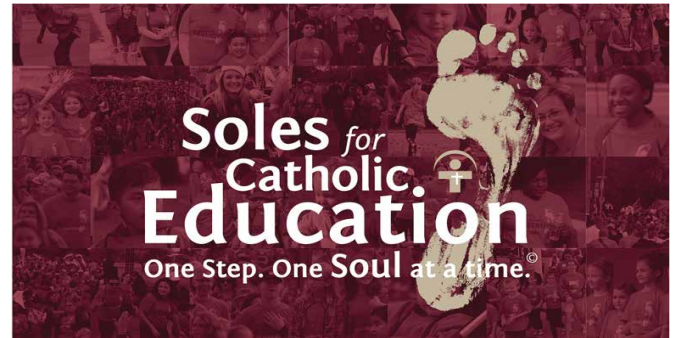
