GOSPEL REFLECTION
2nd Second Sunday of
Ordinary Time

"He first found his own brother Simon and told him, 'We have found the Messiah.'" After spending the day in the company of Christ, Andrew took action. He shared the good news! Instead of keeping his newfound friendship with Jesus all to himself, Andrew invited his brother into the fold. Andrew found Simon and "brought him to Jesus." This was no small matter because Simon would become Peter, the first pope! How important it is to bring others along with us to meet Christ!

Yet, how often do we reach out with the kind of confidence that Andrew had? Are we ready and willing to share our faith with our family and friends?

Part of our call as Christians is to evangelize others, to share with them the good news of salvation. The Gospel message is meant for all people, and we are meant to be its messengers. Sometimes this requires us to step out of our comfort zone or speak up when we'd rather be silent. It may mean inviting someone to Mass when they might say no. But it might also mean a conversion for someone we care about. Ultimately, it might mean another saint in heaven.

None of that is up to us, however. What we can control is only whether we share our faith joyfully and extend the invitation to others to experience the peace that comes from knowing Christ.

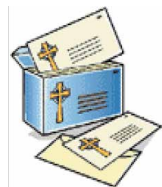
Congratulations!

Join us in the Parish Hall after all of the Masses Jan. 20th & 21st for Charities Weekend! Come and see what our parishioners are doing to help the parish and community.

Christ Child Society: a nonprofit Catholic organization of about 300 volunteers serving God's needy children in the Greater Milwaukee Area. Stop by to see the wonderful works the Christ Child Society is doing in our community to help clothe the babies in need.

Two of our primary programs are **Layettes and My Stuff Bags**. A play pen will be provided to place new items for needy children. Please consider helping these children by placing some of these items in the available play pen.

LAYETTES – A bag of essential baby items is given to needy mothers as they leave the hospital with their newborn.

Needed items include: receiving blankets, crib blankets or quilts, knitted baby hats or sweaters, onesies (size 3 – 6 months), sleep and play outfits (size 3 – 6 months), newborn or size 1 diapers, small cuddly stuffed toys and board books in English or Spanish.

MY STUFF BAGS – A canvas bag of NEW essential personal items is given to children displaced from their homes due to neglect, abuse or violence.

Needed items include: Pajamas (size 2 – 18), undershirts (size 2 – 18), shirts (size 2 – 18), socks, toothbrushes and toothpaste, comb/brushes and small cuddly toys. In the cold weather we can always use mittens and hats.

Please save your register receipts from **PIGGLY WIGGLY** in Hartland/Oconomowoc and **SENTRY** in Delafield (only receipts with groceries purchased are valid.) St. Charles receives 1% of the receipt totals from all Sentry and Piggly Wiggly receipts.

Please use the drop slot located next to the Parish Office to deposit the receipts. **Please do not turn in Pick 'n Save or McDonald's receipts** as those programs have been discontinued. **Also we are not accepting Sendik's receipts at this time.**

PLEASE NOTE: When turning in your receipts, remember that **we need the whole receipt. Do not cut the top or bottom off of any receipt or we cannot use it. Last week we lost \$70 in receipt rebates because the tops were cut off of the receipts from parishioners.**

Also, please turn in your receipts weekly because they **expire after six months. Please do not staple, tape, roll or rubberband them together and keep them as FLAT as possible.** Thank you for supporting St. Charles.

POVERTY AWARENESS MONTH! This month, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops is drawing our attention to world wide poverty. In 1833, Blessed Frederic Ozanam founded the Society of St. Vincent de Paul in response to the plight of the poor in Paris. Today, SVdP has evolved to an international organization dedicated to alleviate poverty by assisting those in need. The Society is comprised of Catholic lay volunteers whose goal is to grow spiritually through dedicated service to the poor and suffering. Members offer person-to-person assistance along with food, housing, clothing, prison visits, and other outreach programs designed to end poverty through systemic change. One such program is Coming Together to Get Ahead (CTGA), is a mentoring program whose goal is to teach individuals to become more self-directed and financially self-sustaining. Your prayers and donations to SVdP support our mission and outreach programs like CTGA.

St. Charles Parish School Annual Advent Spirit Service Project!

St. Charles Parish School students took part in the annual Advent Spirit Service Project just a couple of days before Christmas and part of their volunteer work was filling bags with food and snacks for kids in Waukesha who don't always have enough to eat on weekends.

St. Charles students packed 2,000 bags through Blessings in a Backpack, a terrific national organization with a chapter in Waukesha County. The program mobilizes communities, individuals and resources to provide food on the weekends for elementary school children across America who might otherwise go hungry.
