Thank you to our parishioners and donors who continue to joyously give to The Cornerstone Capital Campaign. St. Charles has received \$7.78 million in donations of which \$1 million was received in the last three months alone! This is a testament to the commitment the Parish community has to the Cornerstone Project.

There are 911 registered donors participating in the Capital Campaign and a quarter of them have paid off their pledges. This five year capital campaign just ended a very successful second year.

Members of the Building Expansion Committee continue meeting regularly to review architectural plans to design a traditional, Roman Catholic Church seating approximately 1,100 people.

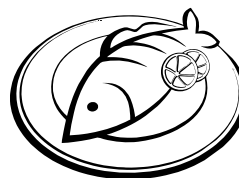
Soup and Bread Supper

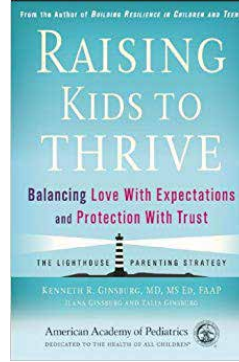
