

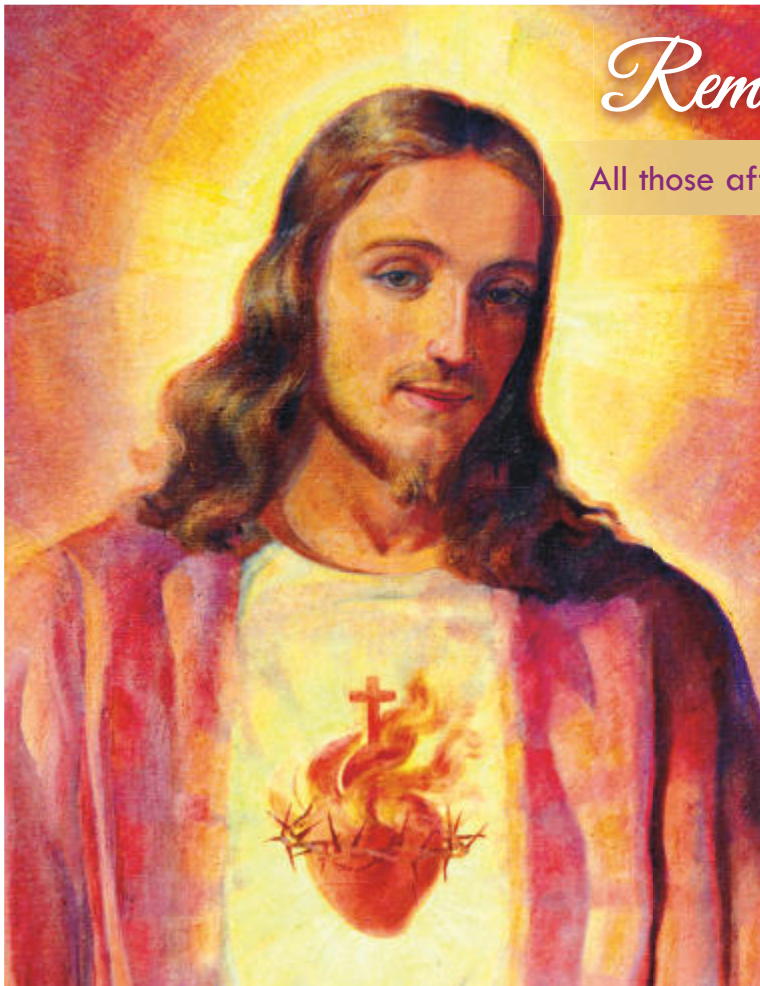

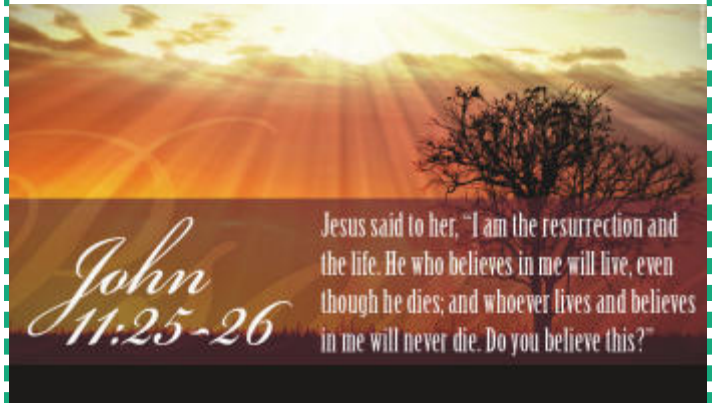

Reflection questions for Sunday, March 29th



• What a way to spend the Lenten season. We are truly in the desert with Jesus, suffering from loneliness, uncertainty, and the glee of the devil at all of it. Lent is a reset for the baptized; a time when we can enter into a new catechumenate and be one with the unbaptized. Do I long for the day when God will open my grave, in the days, weeks, months ahead? At Easter? At the final judgment? Do I ready myself for His coming? Sit with the reading from Ezra this week. "I have promised, and I will do it, says the Lord!"

• "And Jesus wept." God incarnate embraced the entire human experience, even its misery. He did not hide his emotions. He wept, though he knew he would raise Lazarus. So sitting in the difficult feelings isn't weak, it is being fully human and fully alive. What difficult emotions am I avoiding right now? What hard discussions do I need to have with myself, my family, with God?

Mass Update From Archbishop ListECKI

March 16, 2020

Dear Faithful of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

We continue to be mindful of the latest recommendations from our health departments and the CDC. With the latest directive from CDC asking that public gatherings be limited to no more than 50 people, I am providing you the latest directives with regard to the celebration of Mass and other sacraments.

Effective Wednesday, March 18, I am suspending the public celebration of Masses throughout the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, through Friday, April 3. This includes weekday and Sunday Masses. I ask that priests still celebrate Mass in their parishes, without an assembly, including the Sunday “pro populo” Masses as required by canon law.

This is a big decision and I don’t make it lightly. As Catholics, the Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives. In times of public crisis, people naturally turn to the Church for spiritual direction, and we need to continue to do whatever we can to support people through prayer. However, taking precautionary measures is a prudent course of action. I would ask that, where possible, our churches remain open for private prayer and that our people reserve some part of their day for private prayer or devotions.

Liturgy for weddings, funerals and baptisms should still be celebrated, but you should work with families to try and limit attendance at these events. Communal reconciliation services should be canceled and confessions should be limited to individual confession. The 12 hours of Reconciliation across the archdiocese on April 1, will continue as scheduled. For those in RCIA, the archbishop has dispensed individuals from the scrutinies.

All non-essential Parish gatherings should be postponed, including fish fries. Schools are discontinuing face-to-face instruction this week and Religious Education programs should also stop for the time being. All of these measures will be re-evaluated on April 1, with additional communication at that time.

The Chrism Mass scheduled for Tuesday, April 7, will not be celebrated publicly. I will celebrate the Mass with our auxiliary bishops and live-stream it. The oils will be blessed and consecrated and information will be shared with you later about how we will get the oils to parishes.

Economically, we know CoVID19/coronavirus will have a negative impact on our parishes and schools. Our development office will be reaching out to parishes with assistance with on-line giving and other strategies. To help parishes with cash flow, payments for parish assessments, pension contributions and the participant indemnity plan, can be delayed until July 1, 2020. Those parishes/schools in the St. Raphael Health Plan, will receive a “premium holiday” for the month of April. These are small measures, but hopefully, they will provide some relief.

In addition, I am implementing a work-from-home plan for our archdiocesan offices/staff. We will be limiting the number of people at the Mary Mother of the Church Pastoral Center. Staff will work remotely in their day-to-day responsibilities to serve you.

Two Sunday Masses at the Cathedral will still be celebrated but without an assembly. The 9 a.m. Mass is available on Radio 920 AM, WOLF, and the 11 a.m. Mass is live-streamed on the Cathedral website. Other TV Masses are available on WVTM, My24 at 7 a.m. and 9 a.m., and on WITI Fox 6, at 5:30 a.m.

Lastly, let us hold each other in prayer during this time of concern, asking Mary Help of Christians to intercede on our behalf. Together we can pray this Spiritual Act of Communion.

An Act of Spiritual Communion

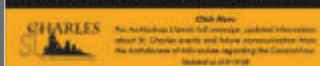

Message from Principal Dan Garvey on March 16th



Dear Parents,

After we sent out our email on Friday evening to notify you of St. Charles Parish School's closure through Friday, March 27, Governor Evers announced that schools will be closed through Friday, April 3. Classes are scheduled to resume on Monday, April 6. We will be closed through April 3 and will assess the situation as more information becomes available. We will notify you of any changes as soon as possible. Please note that Monday, March 23 will now be included as a distance learning day.

Teachers will be contacting families with specific guidelines and expectations for students regarding this first week of distance learning. You will receive regular emails from teachers throughout the next three weeks including regular check-ins with students, feedback on work, and assessments. We will continue to use PowerSchool to communicate grades. Student work will continue to be assessed and graded throughout this time. Teachers will be available via email or other forms of communication that they have identified (ie. Google classroom, class website, etc.) during regular school hours (8:25 a.m. to 3:25 p.m.).

Our teachers have been hard at work preparing lesson plans and assignments for students over the next three weeks. Students and parents will be able to enter the school building between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. tomorrow, March 17 to pick up learning packets. These packets were organized by classroom teachers through their work today and will be needed to complete distance learning activities (for K5 through 8th grade ONLY). Please use only the school entrance. Materials will be available either outside of the students' classrooms or at the school entrance. We ask that anyone who is ill (has a fever and/or cough) to not enter the school for the safety of all who are here as recommended by the CDC. If someone else will be picking up materials on your behalf, please email the school to inform us. Fr. Nick's Sermon from the weekend of March 14th & 15th

Third Sunday of Lent, Year A
March 14, 2020

“How is your faith?...Dormant...That’s not good...Let this be a mother’s gift to her child—the one piece of advice: Find yourself a faith. It helps. No...Not just helps...It’s everything.” During a crisis, whether personal or public, faith doesn’t just help, it’s everything. This was Princess Alice’s message for her son Prince Phillip on Netflix’s TV series *The Crown*. And it is also my message for us today: During this present crisis, the crisis of the corona or ‘crown’ virus, faith doesn’t just help, it’s everything.

Friends, what is the nature of the present crisis? Is it a public health crisis? A political crisis? A financial crisis? Is it a crisis of long lines and short supplies? Of closed schools and canceled events? Yes, it’s all these things—all these things and more. But it is also a crisis of faith. Now, disease and death are certainly evil. They were not part of God’s original plan of creation. And, so, we should take every reasonable precaution to stop the spread of disease and do everything reasonable in our power to prevent untimely deaths. But disease and death are not absolute evils. They are, of course, to those without faith. To those without faith, who have hope only for this present life, disease and death are absolute evils, things to be feared above all else, and eliminated and prevented before all else.

But to those with faith, who have hope not only for this present life but for the life to come, disease and death are not absolute evils. They are not to be feared above all else or eliminated and prevented before all else. To those with faith, the only great tragedy in this life, the only thing to be feared, is not to become a saint. Heaven has a cure for every disease and an answer for every untimely death. But the only wound it cannot heal, the only tear it cannot dry, the only bitterness it cannot sweeten, is not to have become a saint. This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. And we need to live this faith now more than ever. For ours is a faith that holds fast in difficult moments, that does not give into despondency and despair. Ours is a faith that hopes, that does not let fear win the day nor let it drive out the peace, joy, and love which have been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. Ours is a faith in God’s love for us, and His desire to be in an intimate relationship with us—not only in this life, but in the life to come.

Friends, at the root of this present crisis of faith is a fundamental misunderstanding of what we were made for. We were not just made for this life and the things of this life. We were not just made to go to school, work, and sporting events. We were not just made to travel or buy toilet paper. We were made for an intimate relationship with God—to be begun in this life and perfected in the life to come. God didn’t just make us for this world. Because that’s not good enough for Him. He made us for an intimate and abiding relationship with Him, one that can best be described as a kind of marriage. That is why Jesus came to the well in today’s gospel: To bring the Samaritan woman into a spiritual marriage with God.

In his book *Jesus the Bridegroom*, Dr. Brant Pitre says that “at the time of Jesus, if you were an eligible young Jewish man looking for an eligible young Jewish woman, you would not go to a bar or to a club. Instead, you would go where the ladies were to be found: the local well.” For that is where the great figures of the Old Testament found their wives. According to the books of Genesis and Exodus, the future brides of Isaac, Jacob, and Moses were all found at wells. Jesus, of course, does not come to the well in today’s gospel to enter a literal marriage with this woman. He is a celibate Jew and she is a Samaritan woman who has been divorced five times and is currently living with another man who is not her husband. But Jesus does come there to bring the Samaritan woman into a spiritual marriage with God—and not only her but her entire people.

There is a very ancient tradition, going back to the early Church, of seeing the Samaritan woman in our gospel as a symbol of her entire people. For the Samaritans not only worshiped the God of the Jews, but, according to the Second Book of Kings, they had also worshiped five male deities at different points in their history. In other words, the Samaritans had been ‘married’ five different times to five different male gods, and the god whom they currently worshiped, the God of the Jews, wasn’t really their ‘husband.’ Jesus, then, came to the well to bring the Samaritan woman, and her entire people, into a spiritual marriage with the true God. That is why Jesus says that if the Samaritan woman knew the gift of God, she would have asked him, and He would have given her living water.

In ancient times, and even today, a future bride is given a gift. Rebekah, the future bride of Isaac, was given the gift of a gold ring and two bracelets. Future brides today are also given the gift of rings. The gift of God that Jesus is prepared to give to the Samaritan woman and to her entire people, if they ask for it, is also a bridal gift. It is the bridal gift of living water, the water of baptism, which will set them apart to be the bride of the true God.

This is what the living water of baptism does for us too. It is God’s bridal gift to us. The Catechism calls baptism a “nuptial bath” that prepares us for an intimate and abiding relationship with God (cf. n. 1617). For that is what we were made for: a spiritual marriage with God. To forget that is to fundamentally misunderstand this life and the life to come. To forget that is to have a crisis of faith. To forget that is to live in fear: the fear of disease and death taking away everything which makes life worth living. But the only thing which ultimately makes life worth living is an intimate relationship with God. And that relationship cannot be destroyed by disease and death. No, it can even grow stronger amidst them. We can still become saints—no, we must become saints—during this crisis.

So, my dear friends, be not afraid. Have faith. Faith doesn’t just help at a time like this. It’s everything.
