Dear Beloved Parishioners of St. Charles,

Many of you have heard by now that the public celebration of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday services have been canceled across the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Many of you feel hurt by this. We feel hurt too. Some of you feel angry and betrayed by this. We understand that too. There is a deep hunger for the Mass and the Holy Eucharist that is palpable in the emails, calls, and conversations we have with you. We too hunger for the time when we can nourish you with the Bread of Life and the Chalice of Salvation.

For now, the Lord is inviting us to bear the Cross with Him. If we do so, the joy of Easter will be ours. For although the public services of Holy Week have been canceled, the events which they celebrate have not. The saving passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ have not been canceled. They cannot be canceled. And if we enter willingly into this present passion, if we submit patiently to this present death, we will experience the resurrection. Lent has not been extended indefinitely. Easter will come.

With faith and hope in the resurrection, the Lord is inviting us to bear some additional crosses at this time:

Becoming Fully Catholic: The Initiation and Reception of our Elect into the Church will not take place at the Easter Vigil this year. It will take place at a later time determined by the Archdiocese.

First Holy Communions & Confirmations: First Holy Communions and Confirmations are also postponed until the COVID-19 crisis has passed.

Baptisms: Baptisms currently scheduled through March 29 will take place. All other baptisms will be postponed until the crisis has passed. Accommodations will be made should an emergency arise.

As we bear these crosses together, let us continue to pray together:

Live Stream Masses: A livestream of our sanctuary is accessible 24-7 on the home page of our website (www.stcharleshartland.com). Daily and weekend Masses can be attended virtually via the live stream. Holy Week services will also be live streamed. A schedule for these Masses and services is also on our home page.

Virtual Adoration: Beginning on Friday, March 27, we will be offering a virtual Holy Hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. The Holy Hour is from 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. A Holy Hour at the same time will be offered on Friday, April 3. There will also be a Holy Hour from 8 p.m. to 9 p.m. after the Mass on Holy Thursday. These virtual Holy Hours can be attended via our live stream.

Private Prayer: St. Charles will continue to be open for private prayer:

Monday to Friday - 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Saturday - 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Sunday - 12 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Private prayer hours from Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday, April 9-12:

Holy Thursday and Good Friday - closed.

Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday - 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Reconciliation: St. Charles will continue to offer its usual Reconciliation hours:

Thursday - 5 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Saturday - 3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

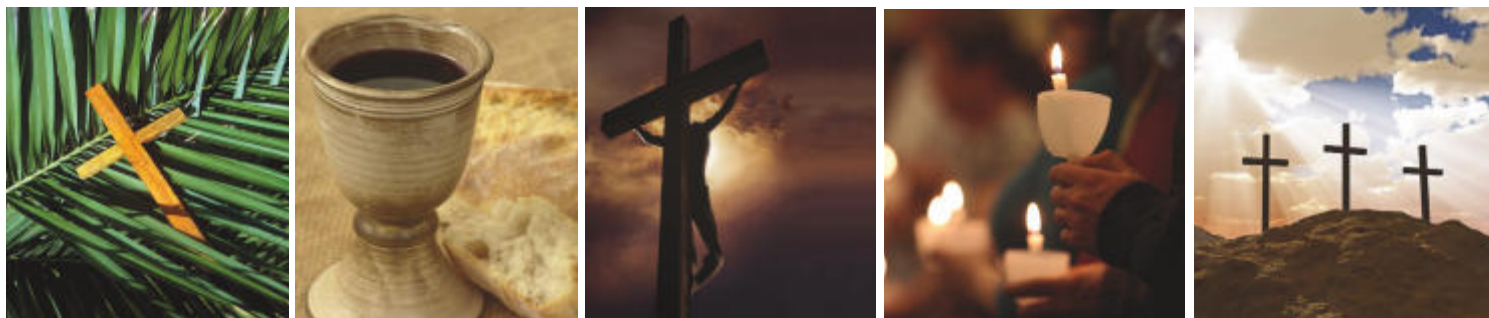

Reflections from the Fathers of the Church

In his humility Christ entered the dark regions of our fallen world and he is glad that he became so humble for our sake, glad that he came and lived among us and shared in our nature in order to raise us up again to himself. And even though we are told that he has now ascended above the highest heavens – the proof, surely, of his power and godhead – his love for man will never rest until he has raised our earthbound nature from glory to glory, and made it one with his own in heaven.

So let us spread before his feet, not garments or soulless olive branches, which delight the eye for a few hours and then wither, but ourselves, clothed in his grace, or rather, clothed completely in him. We who have been baptized into Christ must ourselves be the garments that we spread before him. Now that the crimson stains of our sins have been washed away in the saving waters of baptism and we have become white as pure wool, let us present the conqueror of death, not with mere branches of palms but with the real rewards of his victory. Let our souls take the place of the welcoming branches as we join today in the children's holy song: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Blessed is the king of Israel.

Reflections from the Fathers of the Church

[O]ur Lord and Savior Jesus Christ...effected a wonderful exchange with us, through mutual sharing: we gave him the power to die, he will give us the power to live.

The death of the Lord our God should not be a cause of shame for us; rather, it should be our greatest hope, our greatest glory. In taking upon himself the death that he found in us, he has most faithfully promised to give us life in him, such as we cannot have of ourselves.

He loved us so much that, sinless himself, he suffered for us sinners the punishment we deserved for our sins. How then can he fail to give us the reward we deserve for our righteousness, for he is the source of righteousness? How can he, whose promises are true, fail to reward the saints when he bore the punishment of sinners, though without sin himself?

Brethren, let us then fearlessly acknowledge, and even openly proclaim, that Christ was crucified for us; let us confess it, not in fear but in joy, not in shame but in glory.

To attain holiness, then, we must not only pattern our lives on Christ's by being gentle, humble and patient, we must also imitate him in his death. Taking Christ for his model, Paul said that he wanted to become like him in his death in the hope that he too would be raised from death to life.

We imitate Christ's death by being buried with him in baptism. If we ask what this kind of burial means and what benefit we may hope to derive from it, it means first of all making a complete break with our former way of life, and our Lord himself said that this cannot be done unless a man is born again. In other words, we have to begin a new life, and we cannot do so until our previous life has been brought to an end. When runners reach the turning point on a racecourse, they have to pause briefly before they can go back in the opposite direction. So also when we wish to reverse the direction of our lives there must be a pause, or a death, to mark the end of one life and the beginning of another.

Reflections from the Fathers of the Church

Dear brethren, the Lord has marked out for us the fullness of love that we ought to have for each other. He tells us: No one has greater love than the man who lays down his life for his friends. In these words, the Lord tells us what the perfect love we should have for one another involves. John, the evangelist who recorded them, draws the conclusion in one of his letters: As Christ laid down his life for us, so we too ought to lay down our lives for our brothers...

This is surely what we read in the Proverbs of Solomon: If you sit down to eat at the table of a ruler, observe carefully what is set before you; then stretch out your hand, knowing that you must provide the same kind of meal yourself. What is this ruler's table if not the one at which we receive the Body and Blood of Him who laid down his life for us? What does it mean to sit at this table if not to approach it with humility? What does it mean to observe carefully what is set before you if not to meditate devoutly on so great a gift? What does it mean to stretch out one's hand, knowing that one must provide the same kind of meal oneself, if not what I have just said: as Christ laid down his life for us, so we in our turn ought to lay down our lives for our brothers? This is what the apostle Paul said: Christ suffered for us, leaving us an example, that we might follow in his footsteps.

This is what is meant by providing "the same kind of meal." This is what the blessed martyrs did with such burning love. If we are to give true meaning...to our approaching the Lord's table in the very banquet at which they were fed, we must, like them, provide "the same kind of meal."

There was much proclaimed by the prophets about the mystery of the Passover: that mystery is Christ...He was led forth like a lamb; he was slaughtered like a sheep. He ransomed us from our servitude to the world, as he had ransomed Israel from the land of Egypt; he freed us from our slavery to the devil, as he had freed Israel from the hand of Pharaoh. He sealed our souls with his own Spirit, and the members of our body with his own blood.

He is the One who covered death with shame and cast the devil into mourning, as Moses cast Pharaoh into mourning. He is the One who smote sin and robbed iniquity of offspring, as Moses robbed the Egyptians of their offspring. He is the One who brought us out of slavery into freedom, out of darkness into light, out of death into life, out of tyranny into an eternal kingdom; who made us a new priesthood, a people chosen to be his own for ever. He is the Passover that is our salvation.

Reflections from the Fathers of the Church

There flowed from his side water and blood. Beloved, do not pass over this mystery without thought; it has yet another hidden meaning, which I will explain to you. I said that water and blood symbolized Baptism and the Holy Eucharist. From these two Sacraments the Church is born: from Baptism, the cleansing water that gives rebirth and renewal through the Holy Spirit, and from the Holy Eucharist. Since the symbols of Baptism and the Eucharist flowed from his side, it was from his side that Christ fashioned the Church, as he had fashioned Eve from the side of Adam. Moses gives a hint of this when he tells the story of the first man and makes him exclaim: Bone from my bones and flesh from my flesh! As God then took a rib from Adam's side to fashion a woman, so Christ has given us blood and water from his side to fashion the Church. God took the rib when Adam was in a deep sleep, and in the same way Christ gave us the blood and the water after his own death.

Do you understand, then, how Christ has united his bride to himself and what food he gives us all to eat? By one and the same food we are both brought into being and nourished. As a woman nourishes her child with her own blood and milk, so does Christ unceasingly nourish with his own blood those to whom he himself has given life.

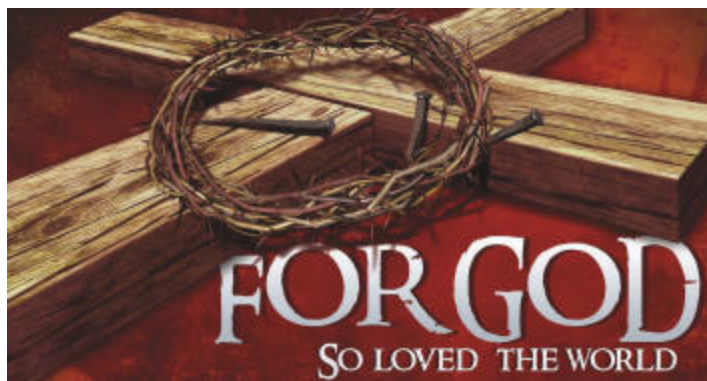
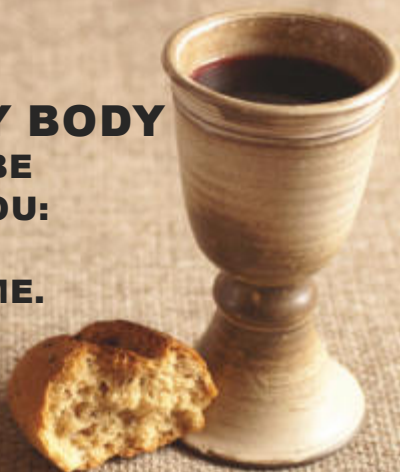

Something strange is happening—there is a great silence on earth today, a great silence and stillness. The whole earth keeps silence because the King is asleep. The earth trembled and is still because God has fallen asleep in the flesh and he has raised up all who have slept ever since the world began. God has died in the flesh and hell trembles with fear.

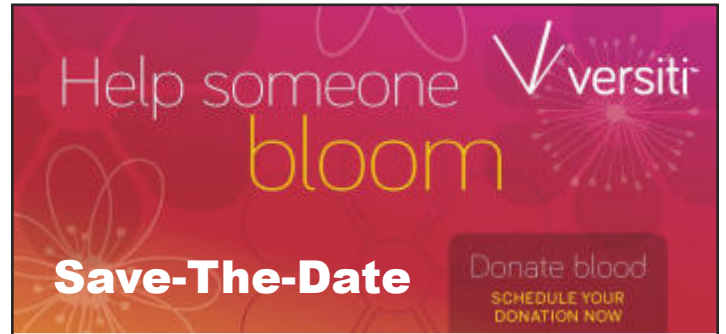
