THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

19TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Be still and know that I am God. Silence is sacred. Silence speaks the language of the soul and is the foundation of all life and eternity itself. Silence takes us beyond the limits of our minds and allows us to seek and to love the essence of all love, perfect love, and being. In silence, we can be non-verbally present to things and to God in ways that words cannot accomplish. We can discover, encounter, and be present to truths that our minds struggle to conceive and then set aside the boxes we put around things when comprehending them is challenging. We can know the unknowable and touch eternity when we encounter the core silence in our souls.



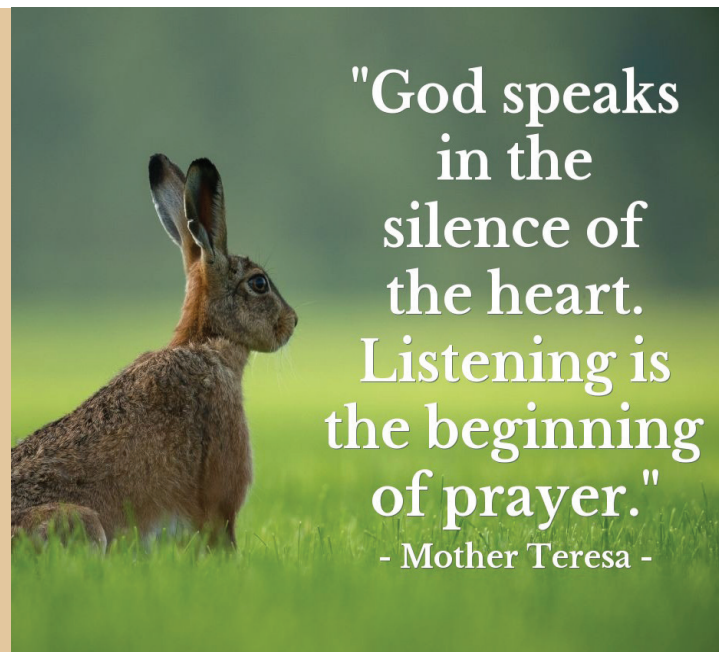
We can do this even on a noisy street and in the midst of the greatest distraction. Once we have made friends with silence, the rambling noise of the world no longer seems to matter, and we can carry a deep forgiving peace within us, even when physical silence cannot be found. We know that we are loved, cared for, sustained, nourished, embraced, and carried. There is nothing to fear in silence, and I can be present to myself in the same way that God is present to me. I can see myself as God sees me. All of my faults, weaknesses, imperfections, failings, and sinfulness melt away in the abundance of God's mercy. All of the worldly things we see as being important no longer are.

It is in silence that all of the barriers that divide us disappear. There is no more "yours" and "mine" but only the oneness of "ours." There is no longer a need to "figure things out," and we tap into our desire to simply let things be. Silence is creative and powerful and gives us hope. Silence is God's greatest blessing. God became one with humanity in silence. It allows us to be one with all of creation, with the moon and the stars and all of the creatures God has made. The smallest particle of creation radiates with beauty. Silence allows us to soar beyond ourselves and connect in ways that the mind can only imagine. When all is quiet, we begin to see that it is only our fear that keeps us from the Lord. It is our fear that causes us to sink and to fail. We can hear the gentle whisper that tells us to reach for God's hand. We discover that we yearn for the salvation and wholeness that only God can give to us. Be still my soul and be at peace.

SCHOOL NEWS
& UPDATES

• Mandatory Masks at School:

St. Charles Parish School has reviewed Governor Evers' order mandating masks. Consistent with that order, St. Charles will require masks by students and staff when classes resume. Even prior to the Governor's order, the School Commission had recommended, and Fr. Ken and Mr. Garvey have approved, this temporary policy. The details and specifics of mask implementation are addressed in the School's reopening plan. The School believes a mask requirement is most consistent with our commitment to student health, employee safety, and the long-term mission of the School. Moreover, a mask requirement reflects the growing consensus among our fellow parochial schools and local Catholic high schools. After the Governor's order is lifted, we will continue monitoring the continued need for masks throughout the school year.

We recognize that masks can potentially be inconvenient and uncomfortable. However, as Catholics, we should consider the words of St. Pope John Paul II on true suffering: "Your sufferings, accepted and borne with unshakeable faith, when joined to those of Christ take on extraordinary value for the life of the Church and the good of humanity." St. Charles Parish School believes the minor inconvenience of masks is far outweighed by the enhanced safety to our community.

Loving God's Garden Treasures

It started in May 2010 during spring clean up at the parish. Fr. Ken said "wouldn't it be nice to have a garden club" and that was it — a garden club was formed. Parishioners Merry Kempen and Sharon Schaefer heard the call to serve and co-lead the club, which has grown to more than 20 active members.

"Without the help of all our wonderful parishioners, this wouldn't be what it is," says Sharon. "Flowers are so beautiful, and they are God's treasures, too, along with us. We want parishioners to feel welcome and see the beautiful flowers He has created by His house."

The club plants and maintains flower pots on the church's front porch that burst with a kaleidoscope of seasonal colors. Club members partner to care for about a dozen landscape beds that cocoon the parish and school, and it's not just women who care for the beds.

"We have men, too, and husbands and wives," says Merry, who along with her husband Lee (who retired two years ago) helps to garden. They also tend the landscape around the Columbarium in the St. Charles Cemetery off of Hill Street in Hartland, which is next to where the original St. Charles Church stood. Pat and Ralph Buzzell, Debbie and Dave Lancour, as well as Sharon and her husband Jim, are others that join in garden matrimony.

The Garden Club has two fundraisers to support the gardens. A spring luncheon is held, and members make salads and desserts for attendees to enjoy while they listen to a guest speaker. The other is a plant sale. Plants that outgrow their current space are divided and sold on a weekend in May or used in another garden area. Due to COVID, neither could be held this year.

"We share everything," Merry says. "If we can't plant it elsewhere, we will use it for our plant sale."

New plants to replace perished ones and annuals for beds and pots are purchased with the dollars raised. The extra dollars are used to help with their service project.

"Let's use it and share it," says Merry, adding that they decided they should also give back to the Church.

The last three years, the Club has hosted the Thanksgiving Bread of Life Community Meal at St. Charles. They prepared and served a full, traditional Thanksgiving feast for seniors in our community who need a home-cooked meal and fellowship.

Over the years, members have made garden items to sell at the plant sale. Cement leaves, stepping stones, oriole bird feeders and gourd houses, as well as glass garden art have been sold. They have even made allium flowers out of golf balls and markers.

"Everyone really likes doing this; it's great camaraderie," says Merry.

There is a bond with its members as witnessed by the planting of a tree on the south side of the parish campus in memory of beloved member Barb Christianson. A plaque will soon be placed near the tree in her remembrance.

The garden that circles the Mother Mary statue on the east side of the parish campus is another area tended by the Club. There are several benches in front of Mary that provide a wonderful respite for walkers or those looking for a place to pray and meditate. Other parishioners helped beautify this area. Bryan Berenson carved the pearl white statue of Mary, and Jim Hallada constructed a landscape screen.

The Club also maintains the landscaping at the priests' rectory, including planting annuals. A vegetable garden is in the backyard.

"We asked Gordy Birschbach who takes care of the St. Vincent de Paul gardens to help with this garden," says Merry.

The Garden Club decided to give its three cut-flower raised garden beds to SVdP to grow vegetables instead to support the Food Pantry.

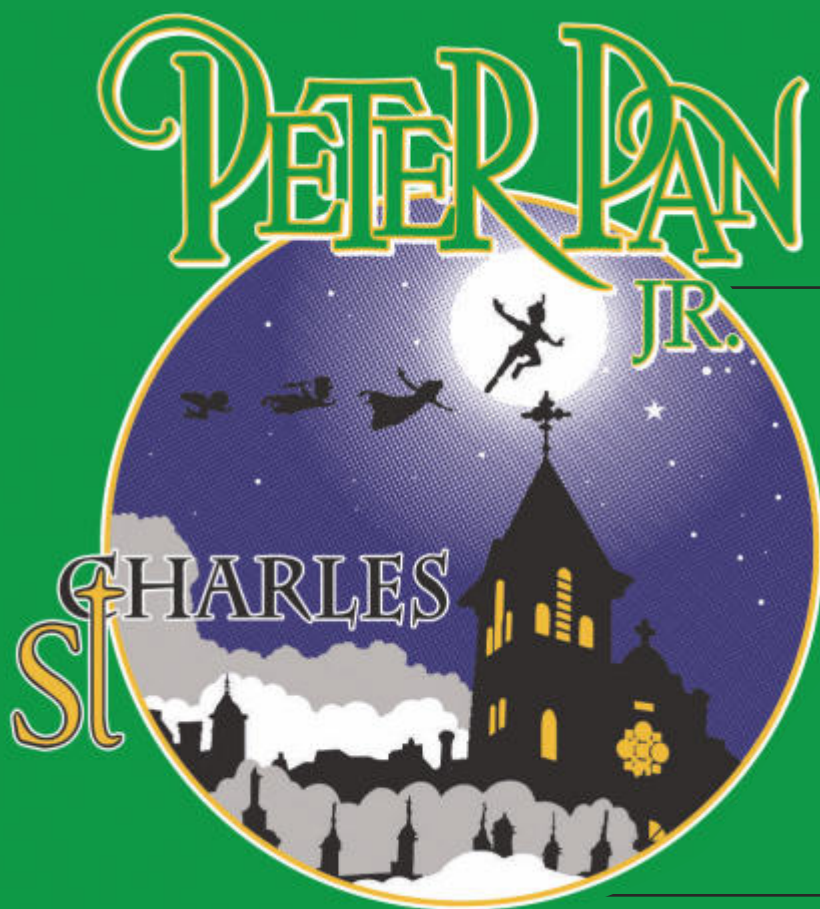
A compost bin for their garden refuse was added over the years to provide some mulch for the beds. Members make sure that healthy plants fill the beds and plants that perish are replaced.

The Club meets one time per month to discuss garden ideas and problems that need to be solved. One year, they went on an outing to the Botanical Garden in Janesville as a thank you for a job well done for all its members.

The Boy Scouts maintained the berm on the south side of the campus for a while, but the Club now oversees that area, too. A scout working on his Eagle Badge helped the Club by building a landscape wall on the grounds. They welcome Eagle Scout candidates looking for a project.

The Club is waiting to get a glimpse of the final new church plans to begin planning new garden beds. Call the Parish Office at 262-367-0800 to join the Garden Club in maintaining their current and future gardens. No experience necessary, just a heart to love God's treasures.

School Supplies Needed

Volunteers are already collecting items for their annual mission trip to the Red Cloud Indian Reservation in December.

The Reservation in South Dakota is the poorest Indian Reservation in the United States, and St. Teresa of Calcutta volunteers visit Red Cloud Catholic School, which has connections with the Marquette Jesuits.

The principals at Red Cloud have given us new ideas to help the children and teachers, so the list has changed a bit. Please be reminded that we do this for 365 students from kindergarten to 8th Grade in two schools.
