Child Formation

(Grades 3K-5th Grade, First Reconciliation and First Communion Prep)

We have a wonderful year planned for you and your children. We are working hard on a number of creative options for both in-person and at-home faith formation and anticipate most families participating in a combination of the two.

Our basic at-home plan is a beautiful, family-friendly Bible-based curriculum which we will offer online support for, especially for those preparing for 1st Reconciliation and 1st Communion. Our in-person plan is to meet once or twice a month (depending on attendance numbers) starting in October, using our beautiful Catechesis of the Good Shepherd materials for all ages. We plan to limit each session to four or five families (organized as much as possible by school) in a very large "atrium" in the Parish Hall with one catechist for younger children and one catechist for older children. Tables between the two areas will be organized by family so that work space and art supplies can be safely shared. We are also offering an online, self-paced Faith Formation program that is intended especially for those who are not comfortable with meeting in person.

Parents please know that because of this challenging year, Child Formation is subject to change due to restrictions based on civil and diocesan safety guidelines.

A Conversation with Jon Ingrisano

(Part 1 of 2)

ENGAGED & INVESTED

When Jon Ingrisano, his wife Liz, and their three children joined St. Charles in 2007, they were in the market for a new parish after moving from Franklin. It wasn't until 2014 that they decided to enroll at the school.

"In early 2014, our middle daughter Rose was playing on the St. Charles girls' 6th grade basketball team as a parish member," Jon says. *"We were seeing her thriving with her new friends on the basketball court, and we were meeting all of these wonderful people in the stands. It was a sign to us."*

They enrolled their daughter Rose, and Jon found that his own connection to St. Charles grew at the same time.

"I personally became much more engaged as a parishioner and more invested in St. Charles once I became a school parent," he says. *"I met more people and found a great number of Catholic-faith role models. For me, I'm indebted to this community for reopening my eyes to the faith. This whole experience has led me to appreciate and realize the breadth, depth, and beauty of the Catholic church. It was a part of my life before but not a big enough part. That's been the thing I've appreciated most about the community."*

THE CALL TO JOIN

It was during the spring of Rose's first year at St. Charles that Jon was invited to join the School Commission in March 2015.

"I'm indebted to [the late] Dan Murphy for that," he says. *"He approached me at our first Auction and had heard of me, introduced himself. He asked me if I'd be willing to join, and the rest is history."*

Under Dan Murphy's leadership, Jon transitioned into the Commission Chairperson role and took over the

Commission in May 2016. Jon remains grateful for the opportunity to join the Commission and work alongside Dan.

"I learned a lot from Dan," he says. *"He was well-organized, had a really good eye for bringing people into the Commission, and had a great vision of what the Commission should be. When I look at a lot of my experiences at St. Charles, both as a parishioner and as a school parent, I have Dan Murphy to thank for introducing me into a whole new world that I had been missing."*

Jon credits his career as an attorney as what has helped him most throughout his time as Commission Chair.

"Dan wanted to focus on policies when I initially joined," Jon says. *"That carried into my early tenure as chairperson. My goal was to assist in shoring up and strengthening policies, particularly for a growing school."*

Another one of his goals was to lay the foundation for a strong Commission that was sustainable for years to come.

"More important than anything else is that we have a group of people who operate with the best interests of the school and who work well together, who can operate by consensus," he says. *"They bring their own unique, professional talents to bear for the school. We have all kinds of different people on the Commission, people who are willing to come together."*

As Commission Chair, Jon has left a lasting mark on St. Charles.

"One of the things I'm proudest of is that I was the principal author of the mission statement," he says. *"We wanted to go beyond our motto and craft a mission statement that could guide our future priests and school administrators. Our philosophy was important and captured this idea of compassion, innovation, and responsiveness. Those are the three core values at St. Charles. I wanted to make sure they continue on as guiding principles."*

"Fall off the bone" is how Steve Houle, St. Charles parishioner and Curbside chef, coins his BBQ smoked pulled pork. Steve says that he has always enjoyed smoked foods and decided years ago *"I am going to get into this!"*

Starting with a small personal plug-in electric smoker, Steve immediately started to read everything he could on how to smoke meats. He quickly upgraded to the next level smoker unit, and the next, and the next until he landed on a premiere Recteq smoker grill that holds up to 30 pork butts (~300 lbs), 18 ribs or about a 90 lb. pig.

After traveling the world through his career in the automotive industry and eating at many restaurants, Steve said he and Kathy, his wife of 30 years, are your typical foodies, trying new places all the time. They met in college at Franciscan University and have six children. Steve is proud to be passing down his passion and gifted his midsize smoker to his oldest son Robert. Of course, Steve is there for his son, always ready to pick up the phone, answer his questions, and give pointers.

"For all the years I haven't used my talents, it was time to give back," says Steve, admitting when he does give he receives much more. We are glad Steve is sharing his love of food for all to enjoy and help St. Charles!

TIM PIERRET

"Our 50-gallon booyah kettle has been in our family for almost 60 years," says parishioner and booyah aficionado Tim Pierret. It was a scalding kettle that was left behind when his grandfather purchased his first family farm.

"To me, booyah represents family," says Tim. *"It was served at every large family event and gathering my father had growing up, every event I had growing up, and every church event we attended growing up. It's made with love, tended for hours, and shared with those you care about."*

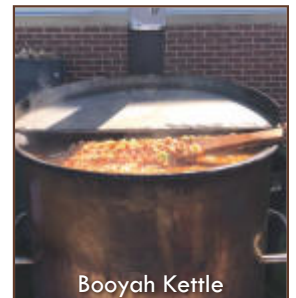
Tim explains that Booyah is the main food offering at church festivals in Northeast Wisconsin since the 1920's and '30's. Each church owns eight to ten 50-gallon kettles and sells out within hours of opening! People will come to the church when the festival opens with an empty 5-gallon bucket and lid, buy their booyah, take it home to freeze, and then return a few hours later to enjoy more at the festival. Booyah is best when frozen and reheated two to four weeks after it's made!

Booyah chefs all have their own recipe spin, but most are either chicken, pork, or beef-based and include potatoes, peas, lemons, onions, carrots, celery, cabbage, rutabaga, oxtail (flavor only), and a special blend of spices. A batch of the stew takes on average six to eight hours to cook and is best when it's left to simmer for 12-14 hours prior to serving.

We thank Tim, his wife Jennifer, and their four children for bringing their family tradition to the family of St Charles!

GOSPEL MEDITATION DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The only way to know God is to love God. Our minds will never fully grasp the mystery of God, but our hearts and souls can learn to love the mystery. Years ago, when life had a more innocent quality to it, we believed what we were told or witnessed, unless there was direct evidence otherwise. This was especially true if the information came from someone in authority. In a sense, we were a bit more gullible on one hand but also more trusting on the other. The latter is an admirable quality that sadly can be eroded when we realize we have been duped. With education and technological advances, we find ourselves more skeptical and less likely to too quickly accept and believe what we see and hear.

For all of the good that social media can do, it can also easily distort reality and truth. Photoshop and a myriad other technological truths can add to, fabricate, and make even the non-existent seem real. It is amazing. How far do we allow this obviously justifiable skepticism to take us? Questioning and doubting are healthy elements of any good relationship as long as we don't allow them to turn us away from a deeper experience of love and encounter. If we cannot get our minds around something or empirically justify or prove it, we tend to declare it a hoax, untrue, or unauthentic and walk away. The very same trust that can quickly be eroded is exactly what is essential for all of our relationships, especially our relationship with God. With all things and people that make a profound claim on us, we have to trust in the absence of knowledge. Full self-investment involves plunging completely into the unknown!

Simon Peter said to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Peter came to this knowledge, which is not "head knowledge" because of the relationship he shared with Jesus and what God was able to reveal in and through that relationship. Peter simply "knew" because of love that this is who Jesus really is. The silent exchange of love between friends, and not an intellectual exercise of the mind, brought Peter to this place. When we stop and think about it, there are many things in life that we simply know but do not completely understand. When someone sacrifices their own well-being for another, it may not make intellectual sense when examined. But it makes a world of sense when it is carried out. 1. If a parishioner attends Mass and later discovers they have tested positive for COVID-19

Contact your local health department and make a report with the specific date and time the parishioner attended Mass. If your city/town does not have a health department, contact the county health department. Follow their instructions. If proper protocols of social distancing and masks were followed, then you most likely will not need to shut down. It is best to notify the parish of the specific date and Mass that the person attended. Arrange for a thorough cleaning of the building before Mass is celebrated again. The parishioner involved must complete isolation period before returning to Mass or any parish activities.

2. If a staff member tests positive for COVID-19

Contact your local health department and make a report. Follow their instructions. The employee must not come to work and needs to be in isolation. If the staff person was in contact with other staff/office members, it may be best to shut down the office and request that those who were in contact be tested. A thorough cleaning of the parish must be done. Notifying parishioners may be necessary if the staff person had contact with parishioners, but do not reveal the name of the staff member. The staff person should not return to the parish until a minimum of 14 days and having a negative test. If able, the staff member can work from home.

3. If a priest tests positive for COVID-19

Contact your local health department and make a report. Follow their instructions. The priest must isolate in their residence. Assuming the priest had contact with many people at the parish, the parish should shut down and parishioners should be notified. Anyone who had close contact with Father should consider being tested and self-quarantine. Arrange for a thorough cleaning of the parish buildings before the parish reopens.

4. If a priest has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19

The priest should self-quarantine and be tested for COVID-19. The results may take a few days, so out of an abundance of caution, the priest should avoid contact with others and should do no public ministry until the test results are known. If positive test see #3 above.

5. If a staff member has a member of their household test positive for COVID-19

The staff member must self-quarantine and should consider being tested for COVID-19. The results may take a few days, so out of an abundance of caution, the staff member should avoid contact with others and work from home until the test results are known. Even after a negative test result, if the staff member continues to live in the same household with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19, abundant caution should be used and they should not return to the office for a minimum of 14 days.
