THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Far be it for us to forsake the Lord for the service of other gods.” We struggle with our gods. They appear in the forms of things like money, power, prestige, popularity, privilege, and self-fulfillment. We like these “gods” because they make us feel good and ask very little of us in return. When we worship them, we worship ourselves. How can you go wrong with that? We buy into the illusion that if something can give us a comfortable life, free of want and need, then it is worth setting other things aside to pursue it. In essence, we sell our souls. Our struggle with “who is God” and to whom do we belong is a real one and one that can easily find us empty and experiencing disillusionment.

The devil tempted Jesus in the desert and promised Him more. We are promised “more.” But in pursuing the more and the satisfying, we lose track of the cost, and the cost is great. We sacrifice our very life in pursuit of something disguised as life. We sacrifice truth for something that only “feels” true. While the true and real God certainly promises us many things, many things are also required. It is not about the warm and secure feelings and self-absorption the world wants to provide but of giving back. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God’s kingdom (not our own), love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, that we must die to ourselves in order to find ourselves, and trust that Jesus truly gives us His flesh and blood to eat and drink. These are hard things to accept and even harder to put into practice. It is no wonder that many, who may be attracted to Jesus at first, walk away in pursuit of the more self-satisfying gods.

But truth is truth. If we cannot accept it from the lips of Jesus Christ, then where else will we find it? To whom can we go? There is only one source of truth and life, Jesus Christ. Jesus has the words of eternal life, and if we do not go to Him, then where else will we find this gift? But we must be faithful and buy into the whole package deal that requires sacrifice and fidelity. When we do, we find ourselves through the Body and Blood of Christ connected to the Source of all life and then intimately bound with our brothers and sisters. We all have to decide whether we want to stay or go and if we can accept what Jesus has to say. It’s a choice we all have to make. ©LP

- As Moses prepared the Israelites to settle and live in the Promised Land, he urged them to stay close to God’s commandments and statutes in order to become a “great nation.” Why do you think so many nations stray from this idea?
- In the opening verses of his letter, James urges his readers to be “doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves.” Why do you think this is wise advice?
- In returning to the Gospel of Mark, we hear today how the religious leaders from Jerusalem questioned Jesus about keeping “the tradition of the elders.” Jesus responded with the importance of being clean of heart. Why is this such a challenging spiritual exercise?

**SUBMISSION AS STEWARDSHIP**

We aren't comfortable with the idea of submission. Our society champions equality, and rightly so — but it's a mistake to think that submission is at odds with equality. To submit ourselves fully, we must first be free. We must first be our own masters. God has granted us that freedom with the salvation He offers. We are no longer the slaves of sin. Now He asks us to be subordinate to one another, in the name of Christ.

What a completely uncomfortable task! What He's asking is for us to be subordinate to the person who irritates us the most. The person we really can't stand. The person who doesn't respect us or appreciate what we have to offer. The person

we think we're smarter than, more talented than. The person we envy.

That's the real challenge of stewardship, isn't it? Subordination. Inconveniencing myself by giving of time, of money, of relationship. Putting the needs or wants of another above my own when they haven't done anything special to earn it.

I invite you to consider the cross — the most radical expression of submission, and of stewardship, that ever existed. If there was ever someone who deserved superiority, isn't it the God who let Himself be nailed to a tree, who gave so freely of His life, His body, His blood, His everything?

To look at him in his agony is to truly understand the beauty of submission — of laying down what you have for the good of the other.

Many people give their allegiance to something until it asks them to do something challenging or radical. Then, they find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it. The same holds for God. Either we serve God or we don't. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom, love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, and trust that the Eucharist is in fact Jesus' very Body and Blood. For some, buying into these things may prove too difficult, and a return to a life without them is preferred. But truth is truth and it can only be found in God. If we find it hard to accept it from the mouth of Christ, where else can we go to find it? The task before us is to commit to the truth even when it may be easier to pursue something else. Truth is always worth obtaining even when it is difficult. Jesus offers us the truth of life, a life that is found in his own flesh and blood and a life of discipleship. ©LPi

*"Fall off the bone"* is how Steve Houle, St. Charles parishioner and Curbside chef, coins his BBQ smoked pulled pork. Steve says that he has always enjoyed smoked foods and decided years ago *"I am going to get into this!"*

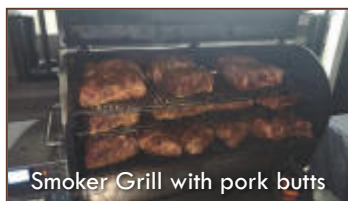
Starting with a small personal plug-in electric smoker, Steve immediately started to read everything he could on how to smoke meats. He quickly upgraded to the next level smoker unit, and the next, and the next until he landed on a premiere Recteq smoker grill that holds up to 30 pork butts (~300 lbs), 18 ribs or about a 90 lb. pig.

After traveling the world through his career in the automotive industry and eating at many restaurants, Steve said he and Kathy, his wife of 30 years, are your typical foodies, trying new places all the time. They met in college at Franciscan University and have six children. Steve is proud to be passing down his passion and gifted his midsize smoker to his oldest son Robert. Of course, Steve is there for his son, always ready to pick up the phone, answer his questions, and give pointers.

*"For all the years I haven't used my talents, it was time to give back,"* says Steve, admitting when he does give he receives much more. We are glad Steve is sharing his love of food for all to enjoy and help St. Charles!

## TIM PIERRET

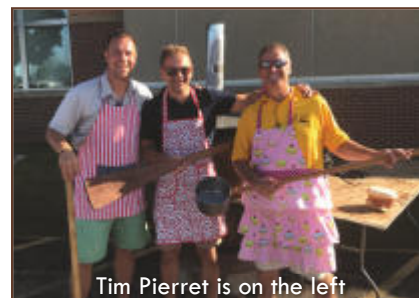
*"Our 50-gallon booyah kettle has been in our family for almost 60 years,"* says parishioner and booyah aficionado Tim Pierret. It was a scalding kettle that was left behind when his grandfather purchased his first family farm.

*"To me, booyah represents family,"* says Tim. *"It was served at every large family event and gathering my father had growing up, every event I had growing up, and every church event we attended growing up. It's made with love, tended for hours, and shared with those you care about."*

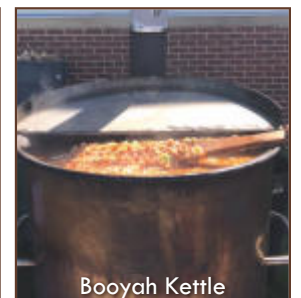
Tim explains that Booyah is the main food offering at church festivals in Northeast Wisconsin since the 1920's and '30's. Each church owns eight to ten 50-gallon kettles and sells out within hours of opening! People will come to the church when the festival opens with an empty 5-gallon bucket and lid, buy their booyah, take it home to freeze, and then return a few hours later to enjoy more at the festival. Booyah is best when frozen and reheated two to four weeks after it's made!

Booyah chefs all have their own recipe spin, but most are either chicken, pork, or beef-based and include potatoes, peas, lemons, onions, carrots, celery, cabbage, rutabaga, oxtail (flavor only), and a special blend of spices. A batch of the stew takes on average six to eight hours to cook and is best when it's left to simmer for 12-14 hours prior to serving.

We thank Tim, his wife Jennifer, and their four children for bringing their family tradition to the family of St. Charles!

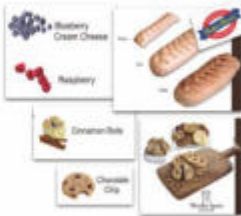

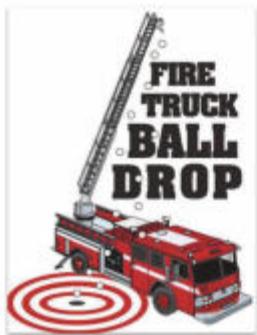
