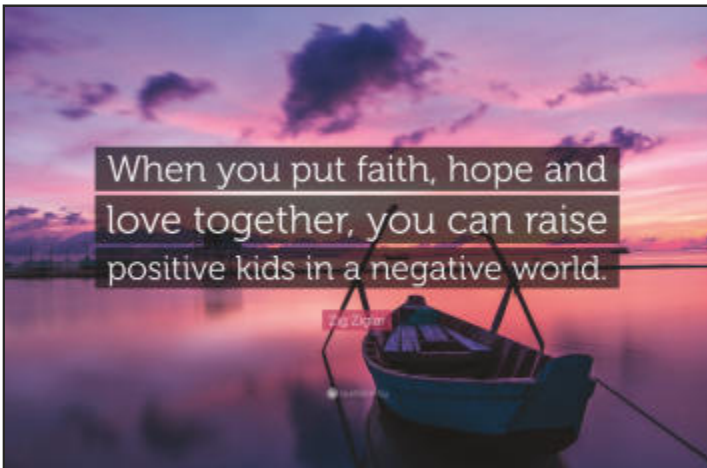

THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION
26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

What are the little ones? They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zacchaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, those mired in sin, the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers and the different ones who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who suffer from abuse and grave injustices and oppression. They are children who want nothing more than to be loved and enjoy celebrating their innocence. These are all the little ones, and they are all vulnerable. Life already brings them burdens, we don't need to add to them.

St. Oscar Romero said, "When the church hears the cry of the oppressed, it cannot but denounce the social structures that give rise to and perpetuate the misery from which the cry arises." Why are so many people still so gravely hurting? We have the resources and the means to make things better. We choose not to. There are still those things called greed, pride, lust, apathy, jealousy, gluttony, and anger that prevent us from seeing each other as people to be loved and not objects to be used. Is this how God intended things to be?

God loves what is good and upright. It doesn't matter who did it or where it came from. In God's eyes, the end result is always faith, hope, and love. Those will always unite a person with God. We fill our lives with many things that are not good either for ourselves or for others. All of us have to work to discover what it is, exactly, that leads to the world's brokenness. There are people, systems, and ideologies in place that foster oppression and injustice rather than equity and fairness. Sadly, our complacency can be the greatest evil. Turning a blind eye, ignoring the truth, and believing that we are helpless to fix so great a problem, does little to move us closer to the kingdom of God. As members of the Body of Christ, we cannot condone anything that keeps people in misery.

As it is said, charity begins at home. Perhaps a good place to start is with our own households and making sure their foundations are properly laid. ©LP

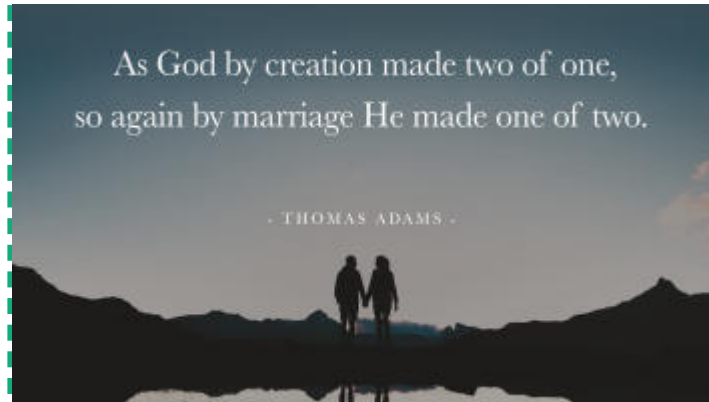

BREAKING THE STEWARDSHIP MOLD

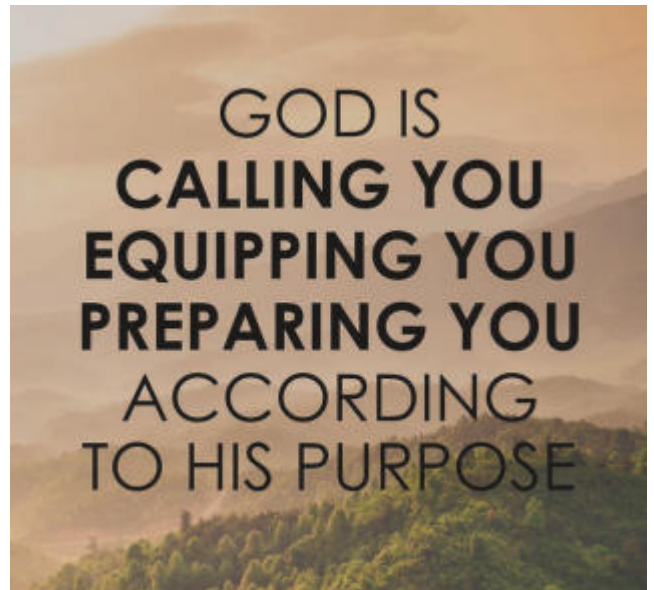
Have you noticed how we always tend to pigeonhole one another — and ourselves? “I could never serve on the Parish Council. That’s for Rick and Ellen and that whole group of people who have done it for years.” “Greg takes care of faith formation in the parish — he always has. He doesn’t need my help.” “I can’t afford to give the big bucks like those families who sit up front can. My offering wouldn’t matter even if I did increase it.”

Thinking like this is a good indication that we aren’t in conversation with God about what His will is for our lives. If we have already decided what we are and are not meant to do, we aren’t likely to pray over it, to discern it.

We have to be open to the spirit of the Lord wherever it leads us, regardless of what we or others have come to expect from us. We human beings come to believe that we are such good judges of what others can offer — or what we ourselves can offer. But God has plans for us to which we aren’t privy. God calls everyone to serve Him in the way that pleases Him best, and only He can decide what that is. Everyday Stewardship demands a continual accounting of who we can be, what we can offer — even if it’s outside our comfort zone, even if it’s something that never occurred to us before.

There’s only one Person who can tell us what God wants from us. Do we even think to ask Him?

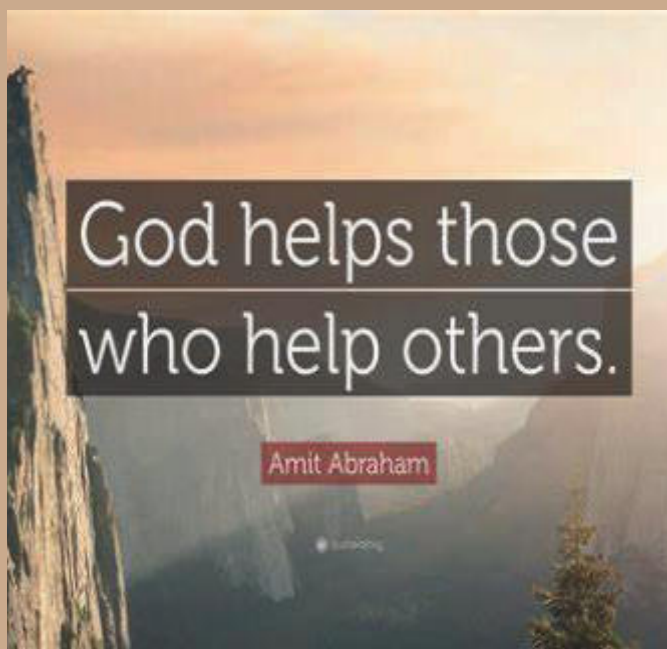

MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT

Be a Part of the Liturgical Family!

As we kick off many of our key ministries in the parish, here are some opportunities in liturgy where you can get involved as an individual or with your children.

- **Lectors** proclaim the word of God at Mass. Lector workbooks are provided, as well as training.
- **Ushers** help guide the assembly to their seats, organize the collection, and take care of various details at Mass.
- **Eucharistic Ministers** help distribute the Holy Eucharist at Mass. This ministry is for adults who have been Confirmed.
- **Sacristans** work behind the scenes to help set up before Mass. They also stay after Mass to purify the vessels.
- **Server Ministry** is open to adults and children (4th grade and up). Servers are asked to arrive 15 minutes before Mass to prepare.

Several of these ministries, including servers, lectors, and ushers, can be done as a family. What a great way to live out your faith along with your child! Another opportunity is assisting with private baptisms on Sunday afternoons. A **Baptism Assistant** would greet the family and help them prepare for the sacrament. This would include setting up the font and taking a photo once the baby is baptized. This is a great way to share in the joy of the sacrament and welcome new life in this young vibrant parish.

Sisterhood in Christ

St. Charles is blessed to have a strong, tight-knit community, and one of the ministries that brings our people together most is Small Groups. One of our most popular groups is for school-age mothers who are interested in growing and sharing their faith with one another.

"We have the chance to talk about our faith," Jennifer Pierret says. "It makes me feel whole."

Some of the mothers admit that they were nervous about joining but soon found that Small Groups are a welcoming learning environment.

"I think my fear was that I wouldn't know enough and would look stupid," Danielle Cruise says. "But I learned that you don't have to know everything. You're here to learn."

Group leaders Patrice Seibel and Liz Mrugacz agree that groups are intended for all who are interested.

"The goal was to have that welcoming feeling even if they're new," Patrice says. "The door is open. We want this to feel like a safe place, not intimidating."

Moms meet once a week to discuss Gospel readings as well as talk about what is happening in their lives and share prayer intentions.

"Discussing the Gospel with other women in our group has allowed me to apply it in more ways in my life than I would have otherwise," Brandy Kukurba says.

These moms have also noticed the impact of Small Groups on them in their daily lives, especially during liturgy.

"I'm more attentive at Mass," Amy Galati says. "There's a deeper connection knowing there's been a discussion of the readings ahead of time."

Moms in Small Groups also feel more connected to the Parish and School and step in to help whenever they can.

"Every single one of us volunteers more now in the Parish and School than before we were in Small Group," Liz Mrugacz says. "We're all there for each other no matter what. It's a sisterhood in Christ."

All are welcome to join one of our Small Groups!

"You don't have to have a vast knowledge of everything," Jen O'Brien says. "You don't even have to be Catholic!"

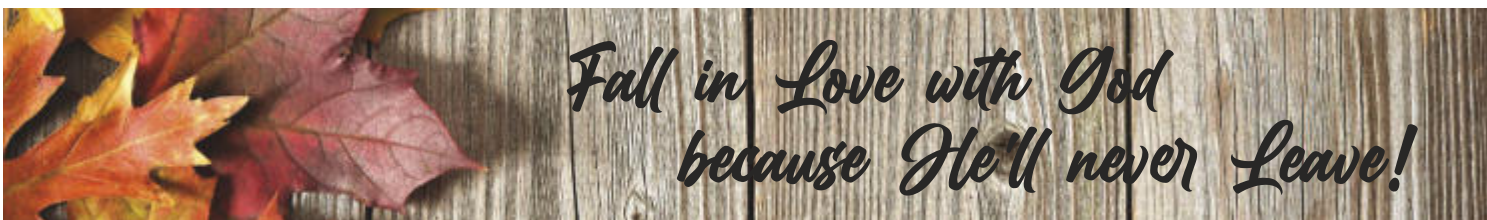
