**LIVE THE LITURGY -
INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK**

Even the slightest flicker of a light helps to properly orient us when we find ourselves in total darkness. Being in darkness can be unsettling and even a bit unnerving.



We lose our focus and struggle to find our bearings and achieve balance. On life's journey we may think we are walking in the light but are really lingering in darkness. We do not see the full picture, either because we are distracted, disinterested, or even apprehensive. Sometimes, we even choose to close our eyes when the light is readily available to illuminate our path. Do we really desire to know the truth of who we are? In Jesus Christ, a light has been given to those who dwell in darkness. God's revelation gives us the light to see where we come from, who we are and where we are going. It also tells us that this Good News is not meant for just a privileged few but is intended to go out to all the world. Is this something we want to see?

**THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION
THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD**

"Where is that thing?" mumbled Bob as he searched frantically on his dimly lit desk for the current electric bill. "I know I put it right on top of these papers this morning!" Growing in frustration and bordering on anger, he flies stuff around, moves books and opines why simple tasks need to be so hard. Enter his wife, who calmly says, "Maybe it would help if you put the light on, dear." The desk light goes on and lo and behold, there is the electric bill right where Bob left it earlier. All it took was a little light!

We stubbornly refuse to turn on the lights! Either we are distracted, determined, disinterested, preoccupied, stubborn, apprehensive, or all of the above. Or perhaps, we fail to do the obvious. We would rather live our lives with the dimmest of lights or even in total darkness. Why are we afraid to do something so that we can actually see? It might help us to find quicker and better answers to problems, the meaning of life, relationships, happiness, and what is ultimate truth. Yet, we stumble along, moving things from one side to the other, getting angry, feeling cheated, being unsettled, resigning ourselves to the agony of defeat once again.

"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was." The light has come into the world in the person of Jesus Christ! We no longer have to fumble in the darkness. We have been gifted with the illumination we need to see our way through things and find what we really are looking for. All these years later, however, so many are still reluctant to accept him. Perhaps they are unconvinced,

disinterested, preoccupied, stubborn, apprehensive, or all of the above. Everyone has their own reason for not wanting to turn on the switch.

But there are so many answers to so many of our problems in this humble Child of Nazareth. A simple birth teaches us about God's tender wedded relationship with humanity. It speaks to the expanse of God's salvation across the globe, and the incarnate Divine wonders and blessings that are a part of our life moment to moment. It calls us to understand the design of world order God intended as found in the Beatitudes, the sacredness of every human life and all of creation and the meaning of things we struggle with most, like suffering and death. We have a lot of Good News to share, not just with a privileged few but with all the world. All races and creeds can receive God's healing word. God continues to manifest himself even now! Use the light to find what you are really looking for!

The Epiphany house blessing of the door is a wonderful Catholic tradition for families. It's very simple to do and is a great way to pray with your family! All you need is a piece of blessed chalk. If you did not receive the blessed chalk during the reverse collection at this weekend's Masses, you may pick up your chalk in the parish office. Once you have your chalk, follow these directions and say this prayer.

EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING TRADITION

The traditional method for blessing homes this day is using chalk (an incarnational image because it reminds us of the dust of the earth from which we were made.) The chalk is used to mark the first two numerals of the year - initials of the three kings – last two numerals of the year, for example:

20 + C + M + B + 21

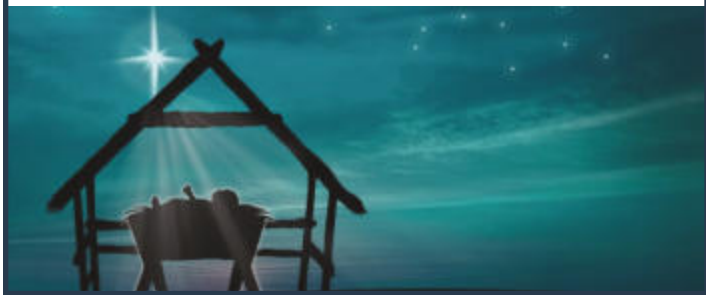
Over doorways. The numerals consecrate the new year. The initials remind us of the legendary names of the Magi, Casper, Melchior and Balthasar, and also stand for the Latin motto "Christus mansionem benedicat," or in English "May Christ bless this house."

This rhyme may be used after the door lintel is marked with chalk or you may use this blessing:

Blessed are you Lord, God of all creation.
You bless us with your gift of chalk.

Today with a shining star you guided strangers
to your son, our Lord Jesus Christ.
In love the Holy Family welcomed them as guest.

Through the intercessions of your saints
Casper, Melchior and Balthasar
grant that we who bless our homes with this chalk
may be filled with kindness toward one another
and with hospitality to all those we welcome
in the name of your beloved Son,
who is Lord forever and ever.
Amen



Pope Francis has announced a Year of St. Joseph in honor of the 150th anniversary of the saint's proclamation as patron of the Universal Church beginning Dec.8, 2020 and concluding Dec. 8, 2021.

The decree says that Francis has established a Year of St. Joseph so that "every member of the faithful, following his example, may strengthen their life of faith daily in the complete fulfillment of God's will." It also added that the pope had granted special indulgences to mark the year.

Our own cooperation with God's will is necessary for our salvation. St. Joseph's witness of his own cooperation with God is a model the church needs right now. At a time when the domestic church needs to be strengthened, the universal church needs to be healed and reformed. St. Joseph is here for us.

Throughout the year we will share new ways to invite St. Joseph into your life and experience His love and grace. Visit future bulletins and the website for updated information during this year.



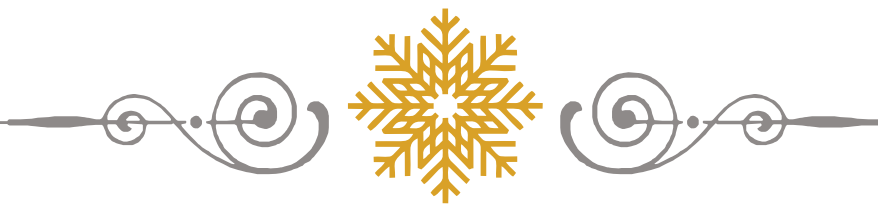
THE BEAN CAKE

The blessing of the house may be followed with a special meal, traditionally a "King's Cake." In this cake is planted or baked a dried lima bean (or an alternate such as a jelly bean) and the person who finds it becomes king for a day with a royal paper crown. You may choose a favorite bundt-cake recipe, and for larger families or groups, you might have three kings.

The bean, or beans, when discovered by the new king may become the main jewel in the waiting paper crown(s). Crowns are then fitted and the new kings crowned with much fanfare.

The king has the honor of ruling the next twenty-four hours, chooses the menu and creates some new house rules effective for twenty-four hours. The king must also prepare a small talk for the family on the lesson they can learn from the story of the three holy kings.

Often the description of their dangerous journey and their encounter with Herod is enough to tout the perils of our own road in life and the need to keep our eyes ever on the star, the light of lights.

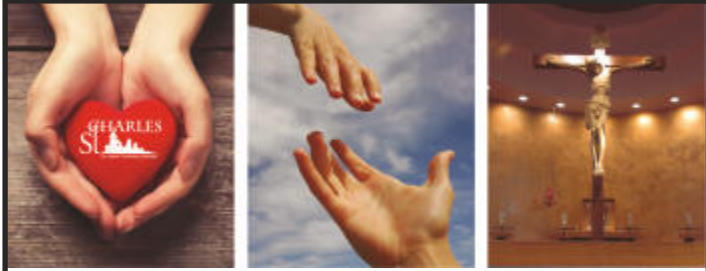
