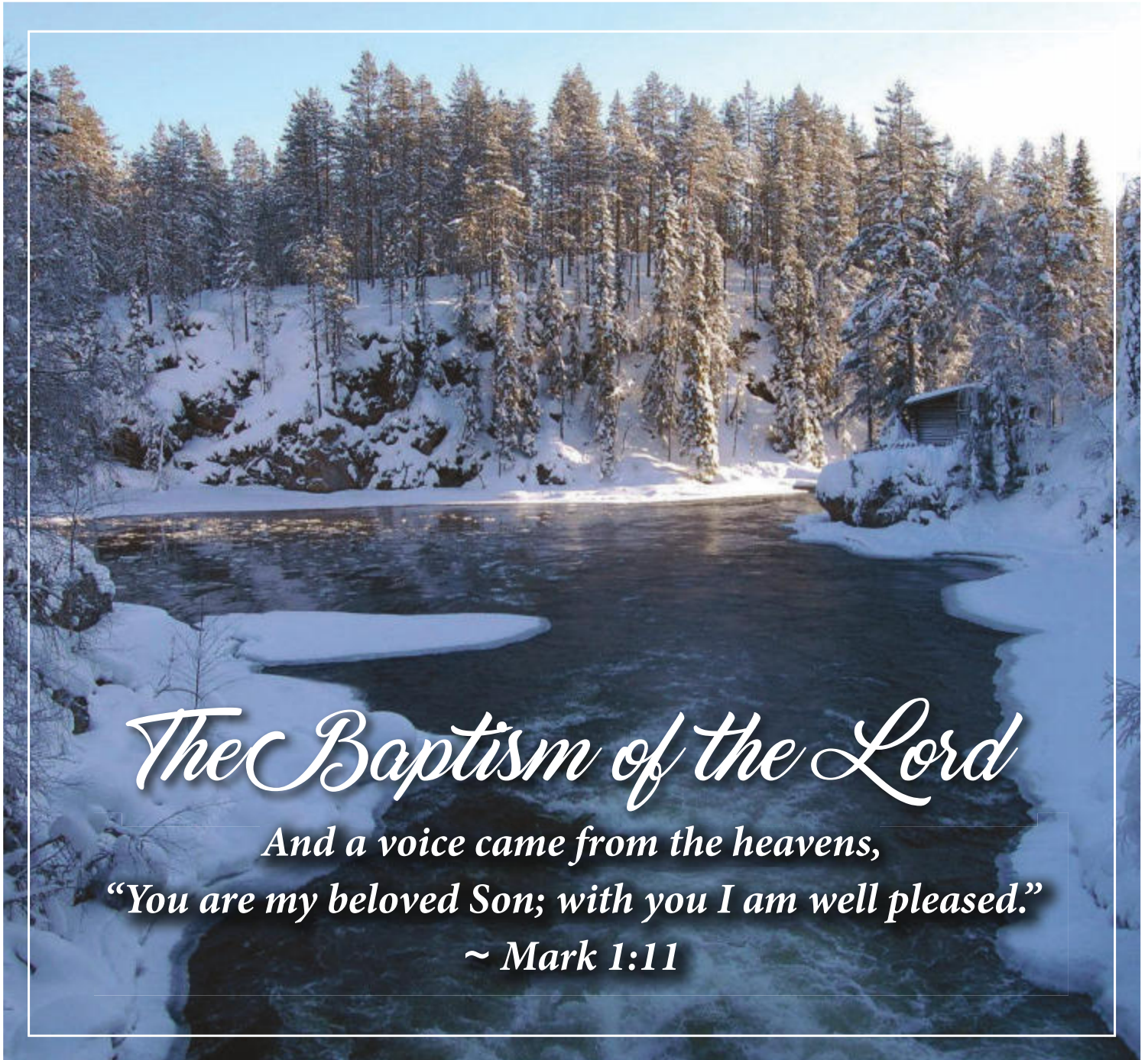

Are you looking for a different way to jump start your 1% prayer life this year?

Sign up for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee's daily email in January that includes a 20-minute prayer audio guide. The daily audio recording will lead you through 15 minutes of prayer to get to know Jesus and how he speaks to you through the Gospels. The last 5 minutes of each audio guide suggests a concrete action that you can do today to grow in love for God and your neighbor. To sign up or to access daily audio recordings now and after January, go to the Archdiocese's website at <https://www.archmil.org/one-percent-prayer>.



15 minutes each day spent in God's presence – reading, reflecting, responding and resting with his Word – adds up to 90 hours in one year. That is time well spent and a testimony to how a little at a time turns into something remarkable!

Take the 1% Challenge and get to know Jesus!

ASK (3 Minutes)

- Begin in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit
- Take a moment to be still, rest and know that Jesus is here ...
- Ask Jesus to help you get to know Him during this prayer time.
- Say, "Lord, teach me to pray."

SEEK (7 Minutes)

- After reading the day's scripture, take some time to reflect in silence on one or more of the following questions:
 - What word or phrases in this passage caught your attention?
 - What in this passage comforted you?
 - What in this passage challenged you?
- Re-read the passage.
- Take a few minutes to simply listen and then respond with: "I hear the Lord saying to me ..."

KNOCK (5 Minutes)

- Based on what you hear the Lord saying to you, ask Him what He wants you to do today or this week in light of His will for you.
- Listen to His answer to you and then respond by saying, "I believe the Lord wants me to ..."
- Ask the Lord for what you need to respond to His word. Thank Him for being with you today.
- Close with an Our Father. End in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

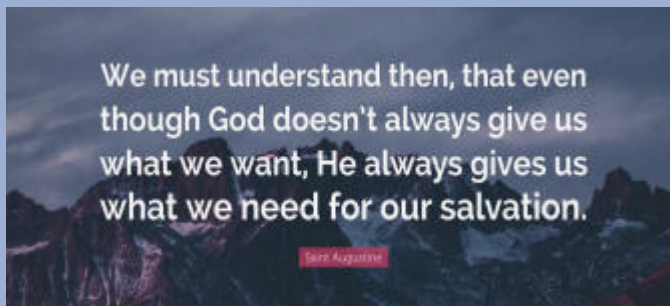

THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

We need history. We need it in order to understand ourselves, personally and collectively. The pieces of our histories may not have always been the most positive, honest, exemplary, dignified, proud and best moments of our lives, but they are ours. We have to acknowledge, remember, accept, and often heal them. We cannot forget them or pretend that they never existed. As horrible as the atrocities of events like Auschwitz, brutal injustices committed throughout the human journey, or personal, painful experiences in our own stories, we need to remember. These times when humanity in general or people in particular have lost their way are times that need to be reconciled and redeemed.

If we lose the memories, we will make the same mistakes again. The human soul needs a strong sense of affirmation, direction, and clear purpose. Without these essentials, we will easily run amuck and repeat the sins of our past. God’s voice throughout history has spoken precisely about this! We are reminded through the voices and example of many prophets and witnesses not to make the same mistakes again, come back to center, discover the purpose given to us by God, maintain a sense of proper direction, seek healing for wounds and be reconciled to our Creator.

Baptism is so incredibly important for the salvation of humankind, not only eternally but here and now. Our existence depends upon it. It gives us the affirmation we need from God by gifting us with the same intimate relationship Jesus had with the Father. We are blessed with the direction and clear purpose we need in order to be

productive stewards and faithful Christians. Baptism calls us to remember, accept, and deal with the sins and inequities of our past regardless of how hurtful and serious. We consciously choose to turn away from them and put on the new life of Christ. To do this well, we must look hard and long at our sins and failings, listen to what they are saying and learn from them. If we ignore the past, collectively or personally, or pretend that it never happened, we will never grow. We will surely die.

People need to hear the message, lived and spoken, delivered by the baptized members of the Body of Christ. It is an essential message of hope that is layered with visions of justice, peace, reconciliation, redemption, blessing, and healing. It is a message that helps us remember what has gone before, the graces and the sins, and bring ourselves by God’s help where we need to be. We are called to do much more than sit home behind our closed doors. We have a message to deliver. Are we ready to do so?

CELEBRATING A YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

Editorial: This year, meet your spiritual father, St. Joseph
Our Sunday Visitor Editorial Board - Dec. 14, 2020

The newly-declared Year of St. Joseph is a great blessing for the Church. It provides a beacon of hope during a dark time and an opportunity for people of faith to focus on a just and righteous man who has much to teach us.

In his surprise announcement on Dec. 8 – the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as patron saint of the universal Church – Pope Francis said it was the coronavirus pandemic that encouraged him to write and reflect on St. Joseph, that strong presence in salvation history who accomplished so much so quietly.

“Each of us can discover in Joseph – the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence — an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble,” Pope Francis wrote in his apostolic letter *Patris Corde* (“With a father’s heart”). “St. Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation.”

This Year of St. Joseph, which began this Dec. 8 and ends Dec. 8, 2021, offers Catholics the chance to grow in their relationship with the foster father of Jesus, learning from him and striving to be more like him.

In his letter, Pope Francis gets us started. Defining Joseph as a father, the pontiff describes him in part as beloved, tender, loving, obedient, accepting and creatively courageous. While reflecting on St. Joseph, Francis also shows how we can emulate him. For example, describing how Joseph accepted Mary unconditionally, trusting in the angel’s words that her son had been conceived through the Holy Spirit, Pope Francis counsels: “Joseph set aside his own ideas in order to accept the course of events and, mysterious as they seemed, to embrace them, take responsibility for them and make them part of his own history. Unless we are reconciled with our own history, we will be unable to take a single step forward, for we will always remain hostage to our expectations and the disappointments that follow” (No. 4).

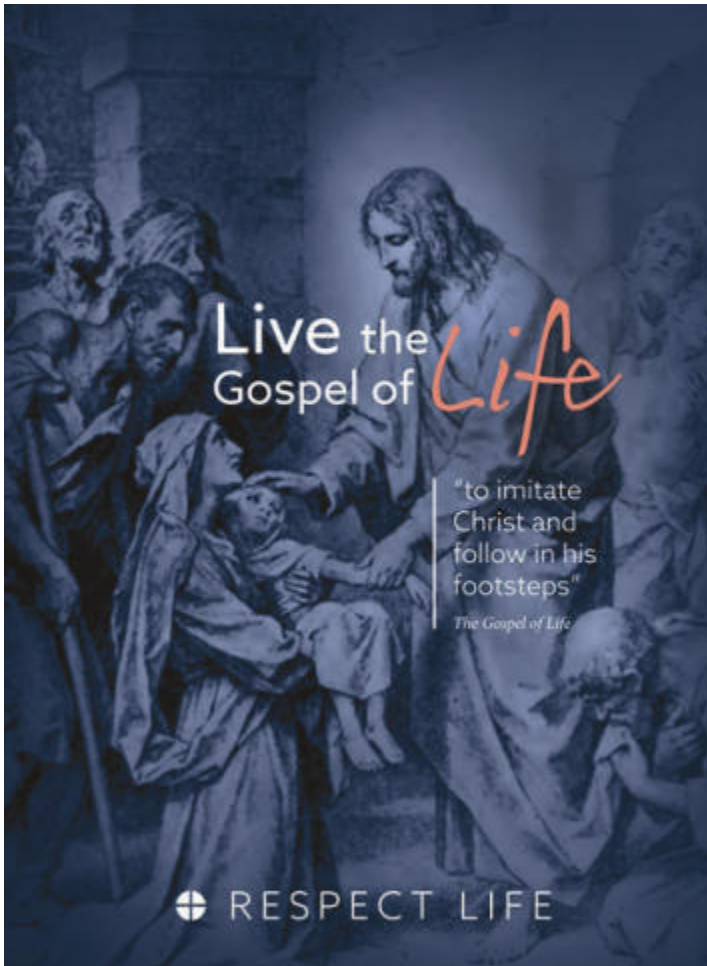

RESPECT LIFE 2021

Building a culture that cherishes and protects every human life.

The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a “throwaway culture.” However, we have great trust in God’s providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord’s help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the “Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children”: “In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.”

As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms. Another way to take part is through participating in special events to observe the anniversary of Roe v. Wade.
