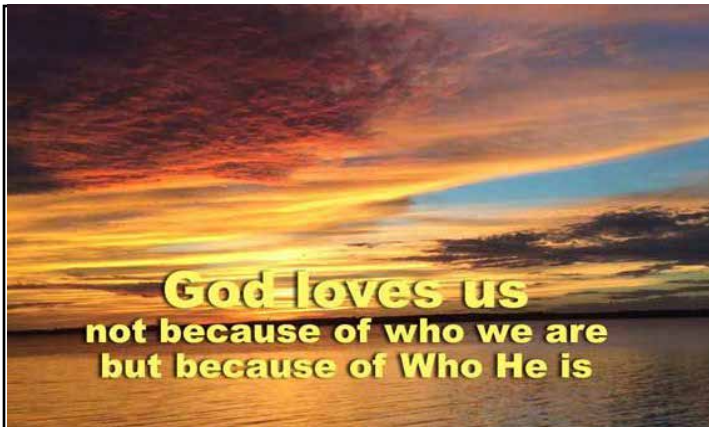

THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

7TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Sometimes, Jesus' teachings don't seem to make practical sense. When we hear things like love your enemies and do good to them, turn the other cheek when struck, give to anyone who asks, do to others as you would have them do to you, be merciful, stop judging, forgive, and give to others, we get a bit unsettled. After all, it's okay for God to do all of these things, but does He really want us to do them, too? Many good-hearted Christians really draw the line with some of these ideals and say, "No way!" They even remark that if someone did something hurtful to someone they loved, they would have no reservations seeking severe retribution. There is still this persistent thinking, even among those who consider themselves Christian, that a violent action deserves a violent response. Somehow, we continue to justify this.

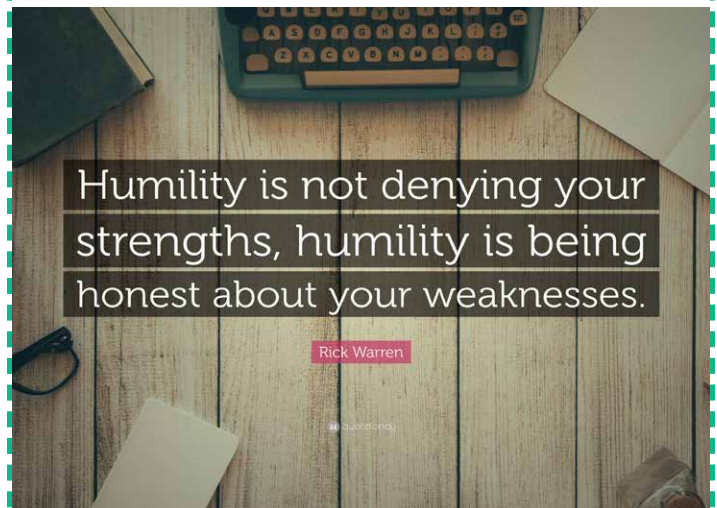
Yet, it is most clearly against the very grain of the Gospel. Part of our difficulty has more to do with understanding God's love. We wrongly think that sinful or hurtful actions and evil people somehow are seen as lesser in God's eyes. They are not. God loves the sinner as much as He does the saint. And, both of these inclinations exist in every human being, even those who consider themselves holy. Both the capacity for good and the disposition toward evil exist in every one of us. Viktor Frankl has this to say when reflecting on the Holocaust: "Our generation is a realistic generation because we have learned what a human being really is. When all is said and done, man is that same creature who invented the gas-chambers of Auschwitz; but he is also that being who walked upright into those chambers with the prayer 'Shema Yisrael' on his lips."

If we believe in God, we have to act like God. Whether we like that idea is another issue. If we don't, then perhaps we need to reconsider our faith and whether we really believe in Jesus Christ. We are made in the image of God, not the image of ourselves. The Christian must, at all costs, leave resentment and the need for retaliation behind, lose defensiveness and bring into the mind and heart the realization of who we represent in this world. ©LPI

**COME TO THE SACRAMENTS AND
EXPERIENCE GOD'S LOVE!**

Have you ever wondered why Christ instituted the Sacraments? We are a body-soul composite, so we must respond to the needs of both! The Sacraments are tangible signs that point us to who God is for us by using the very natural elements of this world. When used with the appropriate words, God makes perfect the use of water, bread, wine, oil, and even each other to help us receive the gift of Heaven! Take some time this week to see how God is inviting you to participate in His Sacraments of Love more deeply as we prepare for Lent.

Baptism: Do you bless yourself with holy water when you come into Church, recalling the seal that was placed on your heart? Do you bless your children and your spouse before going to bed each night with holy water? Isn't it cool that the Spirit of God dwells in us and permits us to receive Him through the use of water and the Name of the Trinity.

Reconciliation: Do you feel separated from God because of something you did or didn't do? Do you know that GOD LOVES YOU – and He longs to be united with you in healing and wholeness? DO NOT BE AFRAID. Come to this Sacrament of Mercy with whatever hurt has been done to you or caused by you and let the Father speak Truth into your pain!

Eucharist: Hopefully your family has a general routine of being able to come to Mass either Saturday night or Sunday. If you don't, start to have that conversation – it might be different each weekend with work or sports, but make this beautiful reception of Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity a priority! Do you have the capacity to come to Mass one other time during the week? See if God is asking you to be united to Him in this special way!

Anointing of the Sick: We offer this Sacrament during our 8:30am Mass every 2nd and 4th Friday of the month. Do you know that this isn't just a Sacrament for those who are dying – although, if you find yourself with another who is actively dying, please call us so a priest can come to anoint them! The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "... as soon as those who begin to be in danger of death from sickness or old age ... fitting time to receive this Sacrament" (CCC, 1514). [This would include those preparing for surgery.] So come let the healing presence of the Spirit fill you with peace during times that can be filled with anxiety and let worry turn into trust!

Brothers and Sisters, these are Sacraments that we can participate in regularly. Grace is constantly available for us to receive and will strengthen us right when we need it. Come to Lord in body and soul and be filled with His abundant and overflowing Love!

"Love your enemies and do good to them." We have such a hard time with this teaching! But it doesn't end there. Jesus continues with turning the other cheek when struck, giving to everyone who asks, doing to others as you would have them do to you, being merciful, stopping our judgment of others, forgiving, and giving. We are okay when God does these things but get a little anxious when we realize that God really wants us to do them, too! Secular justice and Gospel justice are definitely not the same. We need to remember that we are made in the image of God, not the image of ourselves. The Christian is called to act like Christ even in those situations where a more assertive or defensive response may seem more justifiable. In order to live up to this call, we have to leave our resentment and need for retaliation behind, lose our defensiveness and bring into our mind and heart the realization of who we represent in this world. We are not here to satisfy or promote our own well-being and agenda. We are here for God's. That's a hard nut to crack, especially when it comes to loving and forgiving people who do hurtful and violent things. ©LPi

SERVER TRAINING NOW AVAILABLE!

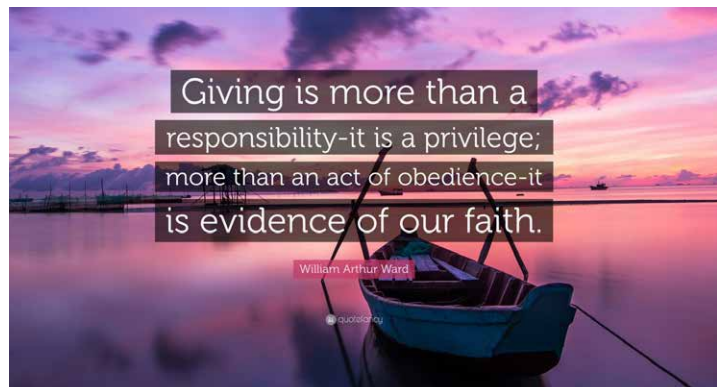
