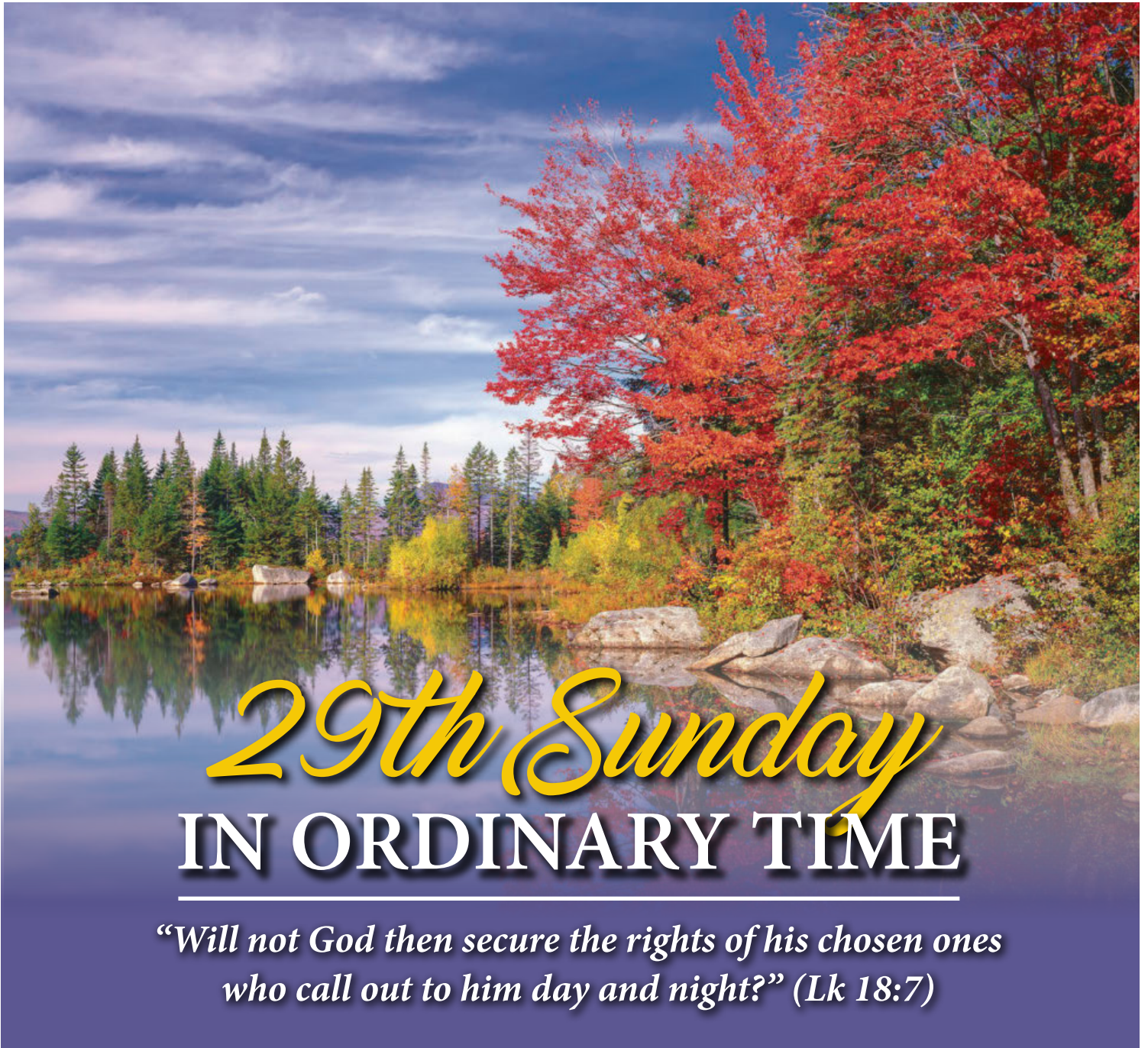

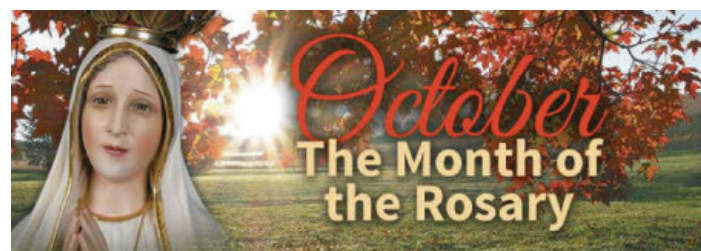

THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Brendan wouldn't stop. He continued nagging his mom to let him have a little more time with his phone. He knew the rules but wanted to finish a game and text a few more friends. He begged, had a temper tantrum, pleaded, screamed, pouted, and used every means he could think of to get Mom to change her mind. Mom had a busy day and was tired. At first, she held her ground. Then, her son's persistence got the best of her, and she caved. "Brendan, you can have 30 more minutes and no more!" she retorted. Brendan's determination paid off. He won.

Is this how it works with God, too? If we want something enough and feel it is our due, does our persistence allow us to eventually get our way? Judging God by human standards, it would seem so. But is this the way God works? It gets a bit confusing when Jesus tells his disciples to "pray always without becoming weary" and then further tells them how God will "secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night." If we catch God at the right time when he's having a weak moment, then our tenacity ought to pay off. What we want, we will get. Really? Sadly, the way many approach prayer suggests that this is precisely how it goes.

Good parents set boundaries and offer proper discipline. They learn the art of being steadfast when presented with determined minds and wills. They know what is best and, at times, have to say "no." God is always there with His full attention and unconditional love showering itself upon us. God also knows what is best. And, as with any good parent, the one constant that is always available and never withheld is love. We can be as persistent and determined as we want if what we are seeking is God's love. We are never a bother, and requests for God's love are never denied. This is the prayer of the heart. Desiring God alone and not only what we want God to do for us places this love relationship foremost in our minds, hearts, and souls. God is never bothered by this prayer. As we breathe in and exhale out, the Divine Life freely flows. ©LPI

Reflection questions for Sunday, October 23rd

- Sirach teaches us that the Lord hears the prayers of those most vulnerable – the oppressed, the widow, the orphan, and the poor – because God cares deeply about justice. Who do you know in those categories? How can you reach out to them?
- In the parable of the Pharisee and tax collector, Jesus teaches crowds the proper approach to prayer: "O God, be merciful to me a sinner." What do you think God says in response?

SAINT LUKE | OCTOBER 18

Saint Luke, sometimes called The Evangelist, is the author of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles and a physician. There is some debate about how he came to Christianity, though many believe he was a gentile convert. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, Syria, possibly a slave. Most of what we know of Luke comes from Scripture, he was an eloquent and proficient writer, penning with accuracy the events he recounted. He is viewed as one of the best historical sources of the time.

Luke was a close companion of Paul's, joining him at Troas about year 51 and going with him to Macedonia and Philippi. Their paths diverged and met again as they journeyed to spread the Good News. Luke remained with Paul until the latter was martyred in Rome.

Saint Luke's Gospel is viewed as one of social justice, giving special attention to the poor. He also emphasizes gentiles hearing the message of Christ. It is the only Gospel with Mary's Magnificat and spends the most time illuminating the lives of the other women around Jesus.

Accounts of Luke's death are conflicting; some say he was martyred shortly after Paul, others that he lived a long life completing his Gospel in Greece and dying at 84. He is the patron saint of physicians. ©LPI

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

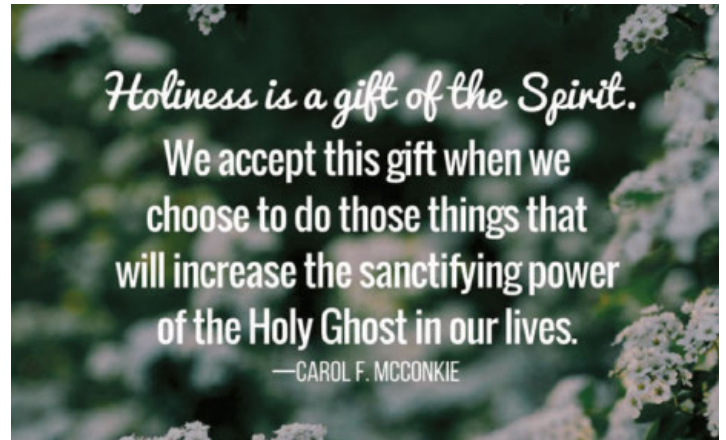
SPARKING HOLINESS

As the seasons change, a lot of us like to clean out our homes and unload some of the junk we've acquired over the summer. One trendy approach to decluttering is the Marie Kondo method, named after the author who popularized it. Overly simplified, it's a process that compels you to go through your closets, your garage, your basement — all the places you collect the dreaded "stuff." As you do so, you hold up the items and ask yourself: "Does it spark joy?"

It's a question that is bold in its simplicity. In answering, you're supposed to go with your gut. If it's a quick "Yes, it sparks joy," the item should be kept. If the answer is no, it gets tossed.

There are people in life who will support our efforts to do God's will. There are those who will, as Paul says, "convince, reprimand, (and) encourage," unafraid of the reaction we give them. There are those who will shore up our defenses when the battle goes longer than we thought.

The same goes for hobbies and pastimes. There are those that will ennoble our minds and bring us closer to God. And there are also those that will drain our funds and our free

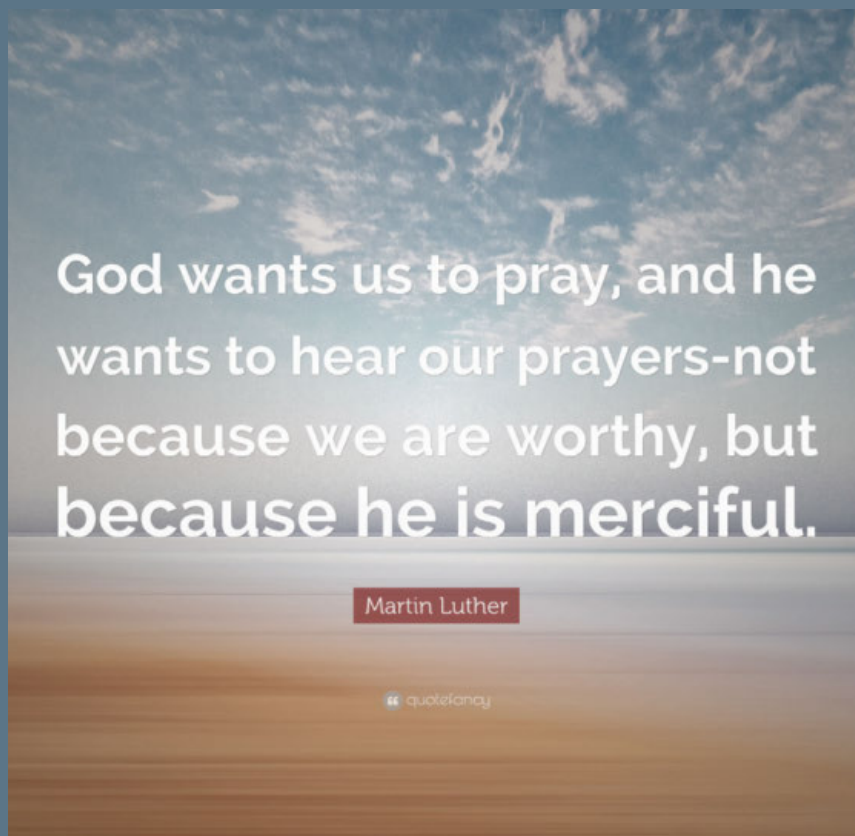


time with nothing to show for it.

During these autumn months, don't just declutter your basement in preparation for the hauling out of the Christmas ornaments. Take stock of the people and pursuits that make up your life. With each one, ask yourself: "Does it spark holiness?"

If the answer is yes, thank God that our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. If the answer is no, maybe it's time to declutter.

MASS FOR SISTER THEA BOWMAN

During October and November, we will be singing and praying with the "Mass for Sister Thea Bowman," which was written in honor of the late nun whose cause for canonization is currently underway. Sr. Thea was a nationally-known professor, preacher, singer, and evangelist until her death in 1990 at the age of 52. She joined the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in La Crosse, WI as a teen and was the only African American woman to join that order. After taking vows, her religious order sent her on to earn master's and doctorate degrees in English literature and linguistics at Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

Sister Thea taught in parochial schools and at Viterbo University. Her ministry grew and attracted national attention. Soon she was in demand to speak to congregations of all races, including the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

I am thrilled to share this music with St. Charles, and I hope that it inspires you to find out more about Sister Thea's legacy. 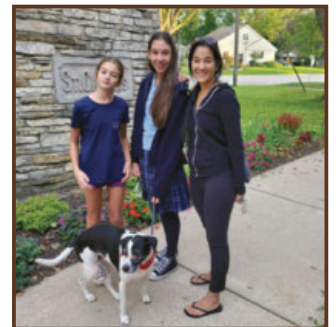
LOVE GARDENING? JOIN THE GARDEN CLUB!

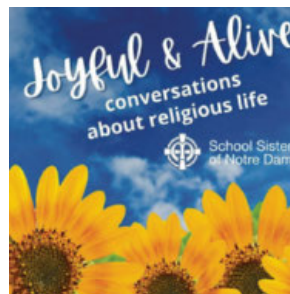

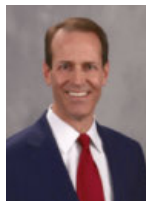
