THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Many make it their life's ambition to determine precisely when the world will end. By reading the signs of the times, consulting scripture, or looking to prophetic predictions that are sometimes centuries old, they claim a certain credibility in being able to do so. Is all that necessary to know? Even when his disciples pointedly ask him this question, Jesus does not directly answer. While the end will inevitably come, Jesus points out that there is a lot we need to do first: remain faithful, face persecution, endure suffering, face wars and insurrections, and give testimony. Human beings tend to focus their energies on the wrong kingdom. Consumed with all of the things we have built and seeking to preserve them, we forget that we belong to a different kingdom, the Kingdom of God.

All of the "stuff" we have constructed will be taken away. All that will remain is God's kingdom. Which kingdom do we prefer? We answer that question by honestly looking at where we invest most of our time and energy. What matters to us as we embrace a new moment or day in our lives? If our relationship with God, the strength and integrity of our souls, and the steadfastness of our character are of utmost importance, then it matters little when the physical end will come. We will have what we need to persevere, endure, and confront whatever comes our way. Jesus cautions that we do not allow ourselves to be overwhelmed or overly terrified by the agonies and disappointments of the world. Although we may be apprehensive and uncertain when faced with complex challenges, God is with us. We will receive the inspiration we need to forge ahead.

God is a God of salvation and new beginnings. Whether we consider the daily unfolding of our earthly lives or our eternal ones to come, God never leaves us with dead ends. There is always hope, and there is always something new to come. As Julian of Norwich reminds us, "God made us, God loves us and God keeps us." This wisdom holds true whether life is stable and profitable or challenging and uncertain. If we remember this simple truth, we will be ready regardless of the day or the hour. ©LPI

- The Israelites recognized that David was anointed by the Lord to shepherd and rule over them as their King. What do you think it takes to be a really good leader?
- Paul teaches the Colossians that through the death and resurrection of Christ, God has redeemed and reconciled all of us and creation and "transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son." How should we celebrate this incredible gift from God?
- While the rulers and soldiers ironically mocked Jesus as "King of the Jews" as they were crucifying him, Jesus offered words of comfort to the repentant criminal crucified beside him. What words of comfort do you need to hear today from our Lord Jesus Christ?

Jesus assures us that the world as we know it will one day come to an end. When will this be? In one sense, having an answer to that question really does not matter. In the meantime, we are asked to persevere and remain strong through all of life's inevitable challenges and obstacles. What we see and experience as we journey to the day when all is one in Christ may cause our faith to be shaken and tested. Trust and endurance are what are needed as world events unfold. Even though life can be uncertain and terrifying at times, faithful people will be protected. It does not matter what day or hour the end will come. We must remain ready and vigilant anyway. ©LPI

Children's Discipleship

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS): CGS is an engaging and effective methodology for drawing our youngest parishioners into relationship, with Jesus and helping them build an effective foundation of faith for their future life. CGS began in Rome in the 1950s with two women: one a Scripture scholar and one a Montessori teacher, who wove together the Montessori method with the teachings of the Catholic Church. Over many decades and around the world, their collaborators carefully developed materials and presentations relating to the Bible and the Mass and discovered through trial and error which ones resonated most profoundly with children in each age group.

In Fall 2018, on Fr. Ken's initiative, we launched CGS at St. Charles with 50 3-6 year-olds in our religious education program. Since then, over 500 children in both the school and religious education have encountered Jesus through our specially designed (and generally hand-made) hands-on materials with the help of our highly trained CGS catechists and their assistants.

So far in the 2022-2023 school year, we encounter about 325 children (175 in religious education and 150 in the school), ages 3-12, every two weeks in our two CGS atria nestled in a classroom in the school.



As we look forward to a crucial expansion of our CGS space next year, which will allow us to meet with our children more frequently, we would love your help! NATIONAL VOCATIONS AWARENESS MONTH

National Vocation Awareness Week, celebrated November 6-12, 2022 is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations.

Following is a personal reflection on what drew David Sweeney, our Teaching Parish Seminarian, to the priesthood.



The University of Wisconsin in Madison is not typically associated with vocations to the priesthood, but that is where I first heard God's call. It was my sophomore year, and the idea of being a priest consistently came to mind in prayer. This desire ebbed and flowed, so I continued

with a normal trajectory of life: I dated women, I graduated, I took a job in finance. I enjoyed life as a young adult in Milwaukee, but the desire to be a priest persisted. Through much prayer, I gained the conviction to quit my job and enter the seminary. Five years later, it's with great joy that I'll be ordained a deacon this April and a priest the following May. I am so grateful God has called me to be His priest.

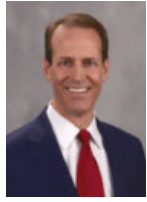
