THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

22ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Isn't it easy to relate to Peter? One moment Jesus announces Peter's deep communion with God the Father. The very next, when he rejects the logic of Jesus' suffering and death, Jesus calls Peter Satan. We Christians shouldn't be too shocked when we experience both spiritual highs and lows when we perceive breathtaking contradictions in our hearts.

Like the great apostle, you and I are recipients of unfathomable graces. God dwells in us, calls his beloved children, and takes care of our every need. And we also continually fail to embrace our sufferings with trust in Jesus. We know the truth of the creed, but we easily scorn the weight of the cross.

The good news is that, like Peter, we are never abandoned by the Lord even at our worst moments. Peter will eventually learn the beauty of the cross when he is willingly crucified. But it took time for him to get there. And it takes time for us, too. This week, let's not be too shocked at these divisions in our hearts but accept them and patiently seek to be more obedient to Jesus' cross-shaped plan for us.

Choosing the Cross

I've been called a lot of things in my life, but I've never been called "Satan," at least not to my face.

It seems to me the worst name you could call a person, and today we hear it straight from the lips of Jesus. It's just one of the many small reminders strewn throughout Scripture that Jesus preaches meekness, but he is not mild — not when mildness serves no purpose, anyway.

And here, when Peter is trying to deter Jesus from making the right choice, mildness serves no purpose at all.

Can we blame Peter? I certainly can't. I'm sure I would have said the same thing to my own dear friend. He is, in today's Gospel, wholly unwilling to embrace the cross — he's afraid of it, even — but aren't we all, in the end, afraid of our cross? I am. It's no sin, it's only human. Fear is natural. Self-preservation is a reflex.

What Christ speaks of today is a choice, one we are all faced with, again and again, just as Peter is. We will not always respond perfectly; Peter does not respond well today. He does not respond well on Holy Thursday.

But on his last day, on the day of the ultimate choice? On that day, he chooses the cross.

We marvel at first responders who put themselves in harm's way for the sake of others because to do so is not human, it is divine. I have to believe that if even a firefighter's loved one threw themselves in his way, he would still charge toward the flames, crying, "Get behind me."

Christ runs into the burning building for us, shaking off not only his own fear (and he had it, I promise you — he was human, too) but the fear of everyone who loved him.

"Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God..." — Romans 12:1

SAINT OF THE WEEK

In 2023, we will be highlighting holy men and women from the Americas who are canonized or in the process of canonization. We hope their stories inspire your faith!

Venerable Mother Mary Theresa Dudzik



Josephine Dudzik was born on August 30, 1860 in a village in Poland called Plocicz. When she was 21, she immigrated with her family to Chicago to seek a better life. Josephine was interested in her faith and spiritual life, so she joined the Third Order Secular of St. Francis at her family's parish with a friend. During this time, Chicago

was experiencing a long depression along with the rest of the region. Faced with poverty all around her, she began doing what she could to care for impoverished people, even bringing them into her home.

As she cared for the poor, her vision of what could be possible when it came to her service to those in need grew. She consulted with the pastor of her parish about organizing women at the parish to help her in her endeavors and about the possibility of even purchasing a larger home specifically to care for the poor in their community. He agreed to support her dream with one condition — that she and the other women involved start a religious congregation. She agreed and, along with other women from the Third Order Secular of St. Francis, established the Franciscan Sisters of the Blessed Kunegunda (Polish Saint). Her new order officially began in December 1894 and was the first order of religious women founded within Chicago city limits.

In 1900, Theresa and four friends took their profession of vows. She took the name Mary Theresa and led the congregation as their superior for ten years. During this time, Sister Theresa started and operated the St. Joseph's Home for the Aged and Crippled, St. Vincent's Orphanage, and worked to build a daycare and institutions of education. They served the poorest of the poor, and she quickly became known locally as Chicago's Apostle of Mercy.

After 10 years as the congregation's superior, she was removed due to a nasty rumor that she was mismanaging the mission's funding. She obediently took on more menial tasks in the congregation without complaint and continued to serve in whatever role she was given — unwavering in her service to the people of Chicago alongside her sisters. Her best friend, Sister Wysinski, was made superior instead, and they continued their work together that way, expanding the congregation together to 160 women by the late 1910's!

In 1918, Sr. Theresa contracted cancer, and on September 20 of the same year, she passed away. Posthumously, she was given the title of Mother in recognition of her role as the foundress of what is now called the Franciscan Sisters of Chicago. In 1994, Saint Pope John Paul II gave Mother Mary Theresa Dudzik the title of Venerable. ©LPi

TESTIMONIAL BY PARISHIONER MARY JO DOWNING

WHAT ADORATION MEANS TO ME

*Adoration became an integral part of my journey
back to my Catholic faith.*

This passage from the bible resonated with me and moved me further to adoration. Matthew 26:40 -41, "Then He came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and He said to Peter, 'So could you not stay awake with me for one hour? Stay awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit is indeed willing, but the flesh is weak.'"

I committed myself to spend an hour a week in the presence of Jesus each week. I wondered how that would work. I was concerned how I would fill an hour with prayer, so I gathered together some prayer books and prayer cards. I brought air pods to listen to prayers and pray the rosary. It all filled an hour. But I soon discovered it is not all about me talking and praying to Jesus I allowed it to become a conversation. I have always been a better listener than talker, so it is a two-way conversation. Talk and listen. I give Jesus time to talk to me. We need some silence in our lives to do that. Adoration is the time and place for that.

I do talk to Jesus throughout the day. The Holy Spirit guides me in many ways, and I know He is always present. But to be in His presence, in His space in the chapel is a special time with Him. I have come to accept distractions and don't worry about them during that hour because they are inevitable. It is better to have distractions than to spend no time at all with Our Lord. I do pray to get better at avoiding distractions. I trust the Lord will assist me with that and my conversations with Him will improve.

Today I spent my Holy Hour with a young mother, her son (5th grade), and daughter (2nd Grade). I saw Jesus smiling and the angels rejoicing. How pleased He was to have us there together; young and old, all adoring in our own way, our own prayers and conversations.
