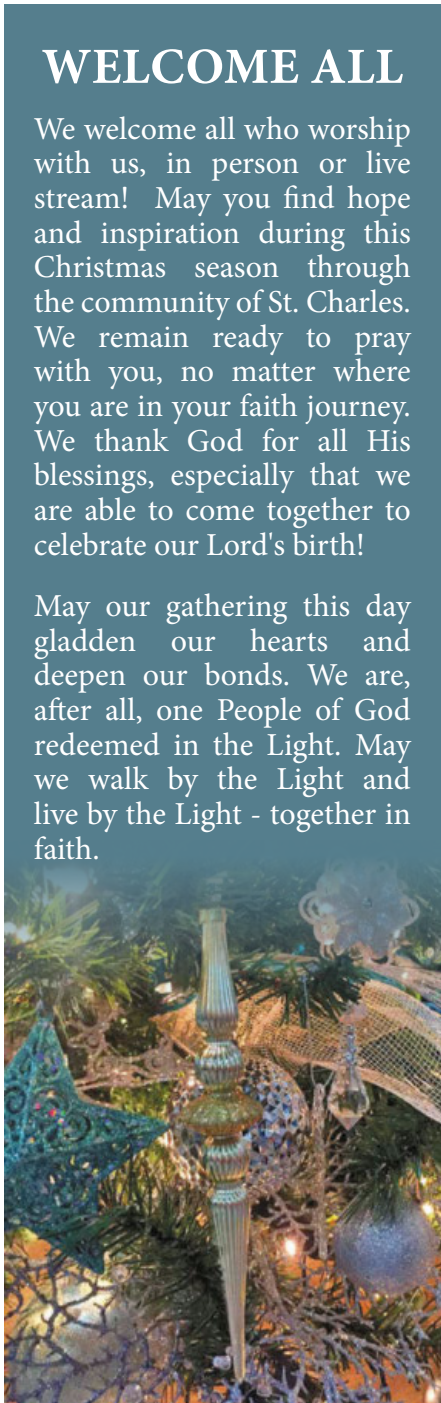
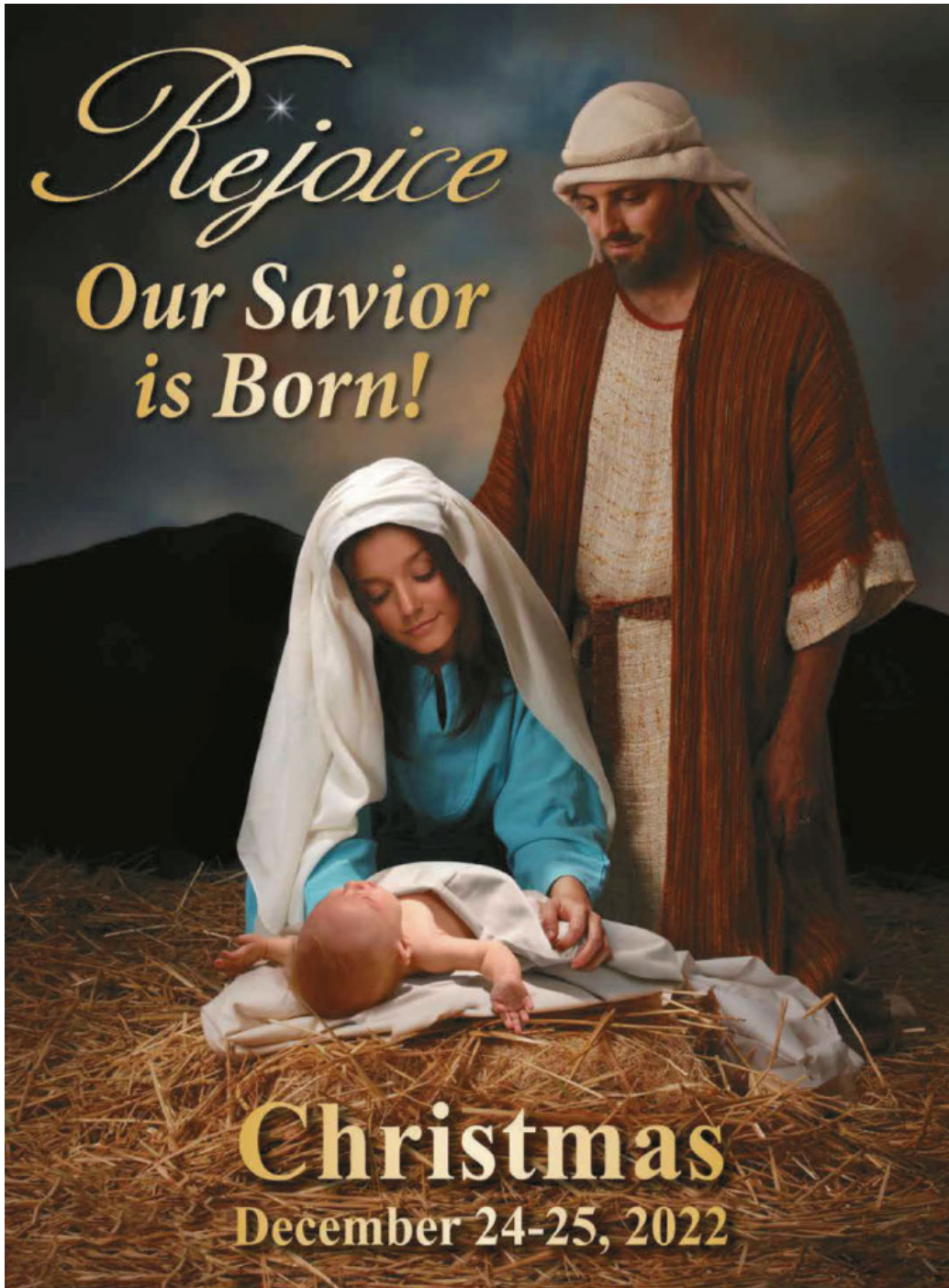

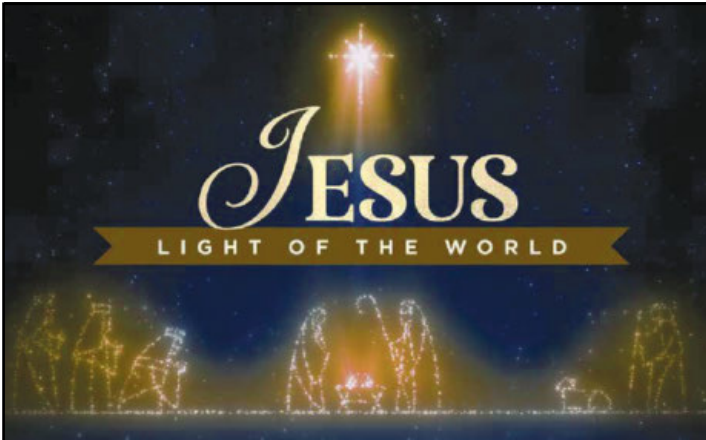

THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION
THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD

As we age, time seems to pass more quickly. Years seemingly fly by as one holiday flows into the next, January quickly becomes December and life maintains its hectic pace. What do we accomplish in all of that busyness? Perhaps technology is responsible for some of the frenzy, keeping us isolated in our social media worlds, communicating through texts rather than in person, and always connected to world events. We're over stimulated in many ways by information, noise, opinions, and ideologies. Yet, we still find the time to decorate our homes, purchase gifts, and plan Christmas gatherings. We know, however, that the true meaning of Christmas is not found in twinkling lights, beautifully adorned trees, perfectly set tables or exchanged gifts. We are being called to something deeper and more authentic.

Christmas reminds us to look for God along the way of our lives and not get distracted by the illusions around us. Our world's complexity can leave us feeling displaced, desperate, alone, neglected, and unimportant. Joseph and Mary felt that way, too. In the midst of all that captures and intrigues us in our self-created virtual worlds, is this longing for the anchor of faith to keep us grounded and make sense of it all. Only faith can give us the perspective to see what truly matters in life. We discover our divinely blessed humanity. The uncertain and challenging journey to Bethlehem gives way to the tender moments of birth and its embrace. Christmas softens us and slows us down a bit. It shows us Jesus as the light who enlightens everyone. It shows us the truth.

The faith that comes from Christmas calms our fears and allows us to go into the nighttime of our lives courageously. We are never lost or alone. We need to stop and savor more of life's moments before they slip away in time. God is with us, loving us, and leading us where we need to be. God is born again and again in every soul willing to give birth to His presence. God connects us and provides us with a place where we feel safe and welcome: home. Merry Christmas! ©LPI

Reflection questions for Sunday, January 1st

- Paul teaches "the fullness of time had come" in Mary's birth of Jesus in that all believers are now "heir" (adopted sons and daughters) to God's promises made to Israel. Have you ever been "heir" to something from your family?
- Luke teaches us that Mary — even as a young woman — reflected in her heart the events she was experiencing with her newborn son, Jesus. How often do you pray and reflect on events within your own life or in the life of others?

Dear Parishioners,

Joy to the world, the Lord has come! We all have probably heard the opening line of this iconic Christmas song, “Joy to the World.” The melodic tune along with the lyrics create a wonderful piece that communicates joy harmoniously. In fact, as one listens to it, it is impossible not to sing along. One cannot help but experience the contagious joy the song communicates. But what really makes this carol so great is how easily it transforms the joy it speaks of into an experience itself. All creation, it reads, even “heaven and nature sing, ‘joy to the world.’” The song really conveys joy, and this is the key to experience Christmas.

And yet, Christmas has always been subject to many misunderstandings. Superficialities, taking refuge in familiarity, the anxiety of gifting, and so forth have displaced our focus on what is truly essential about Christmas. Does all this convey any joy at all? Probably not. What conveys joys is that God, eternal and infinite Divinity, becomes flesh and allows us to contemplate Him as one of us, as a little child wrapped in swaddling clothes. God, who is invisible, becomes so very visible before our eyes. What more could we have that can fill our hearts with joy?

This is the joy expressed in angelic words, “Glory to God in the highest.” Imagine the joy that accompanied these words. Or better yet, contemplate the joy of the shepherds who, upon hearing these words, rushed to go see for themselves. I can assure you that these words communicated such joy that the shepherds could not wait to go and see with their own eyes what they were told by the angels.

This is the essence of Christmas. The contemplation of God becoming one of us. The angels delivered glad tidings with great joy for those to whom their Savior was born. The newborn Savior was the source of such unsurpassable joy.

Tonight, as we anticipate His birth once again, let us open our hearts and experience this joy. Therefore, come, let us see for ourselves that our Savior has come. Experience the joy of his birth by contemplating how the melodic sound of his birth in your hearts accompanies the joy of Christmas as we sing “Glory to God in the highest” at Christmas. Someone once told me that if our Catholic faith is to persevere, it was up to me to respond to God's grace. It was MY responsibility to use what had been given to me in faith. Fear and anxiety overwhelmed me when I thought of the task at hand...reversing a downward trend of people leaving our Church and our beautiful Catholic faith. Luckily, this gentleman presented the same challenge to the person sitting next to me, behind me, and in front of me! I was not alone.

St. Charles is alive and growing! So why should I be concerned? We have vibrant Masses; we have a music ministry that adds extra life to the liturgy; we have so many ministries that help people within and beyond this parish; and our school is bursting at its seams. Even in a parish that is as lively as ours, there are still ones who feel lost, lonely, unseen, unloved, and who think they don't or can't measure up to Christ's call for them to respond. I felt called to make sure that those people knew they were not alone.

The Reach More training is a beautiful, well-thought, thorough process with everything you need to bring people closer to God - written materials/ guidelines, scripture readings, and entertaining videos. In addition to the Reach More journey itself that inspired me, it was the sincere care from the leaders, and the camaraderie, fellowship, and respect that our group had established that made the sessions worthwhile. Moreover, it was a desire to share the Good News of our faith in a small group setting that brought me back each week. It was bittersweet to complete the journey as our small group became quite close; however, each member of our group knew that this was not the end but the beginning of our call to reach more people, make more disciples, and revitalize our Catholic faith. The responsibility is on us to say YES to God, and Reach More prepared us to do so! We are a community of faith, and together we can do the work that Jesus commanded us to do: to make more disciples!

WHAT IS ADORATION?

Adoration is a quiet time spent in prayer before Jesus present in the Eucharist. A Consecrated Host is placed in the center of a sacred vessel called a Monstrance. The word Monstrance means "to show." The Monstrance is then set in a very special place for all to see and worship. Jesus truly is present body, blood, soul and divinity in the Consecrated Host or "Blessed Sacrament."

The Catechism quotes Pope John Paul II: "The Church and the world have a great need for Eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go to meet him in adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the serious offenses and crimes of the world. Let our adoration never cease." (CCC, 1380)

Every vocation in the Church comes from and through Christ Jesus. It is he who calls. Spending time in Eucharistic Adoration with our Divine Lord and Friend is a good place to go to ask what he wants with our life. Why not spend some time each week in adoration, in union, in contemplation of the Lord present in the Eucharist?

WHAT DO I DO DURING EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

If you attend Adoration at your parish, it will most likely be in a small chapel or part of the Church. As a form of respect, you should always genuflect when you see the Lord in the Host. Maintain an attitude of respect, and if others are present, silence. On retreats or other special occasions, there may be music playing to help foster a spirit of prayer, worship, and Adoration. Always keep in mind that you are in the presence of God!

Kneeling, sitting, standing, and even laying on the floor before the Blessed Sacrament are all appropriate forms of prayer. Let your posture reflect your worship of the King and do what is comfortable for you.

You really don't have to "do" anything during Adoration. You can just sit there and look at Jesus. Take the time to be with Him. If you are the only person in the chapel, don't be afraid to pray or sing aloud. This is your personal time with Christ.

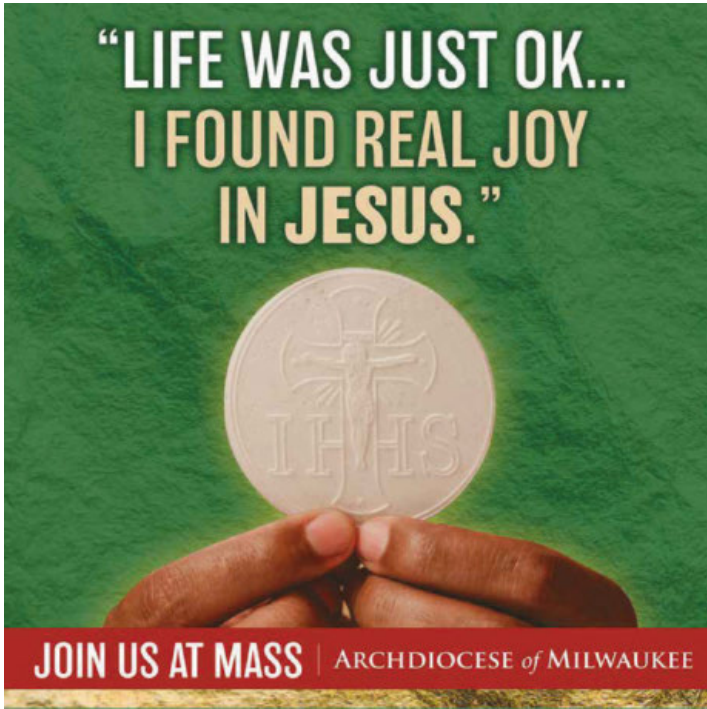

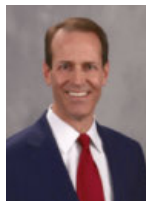
