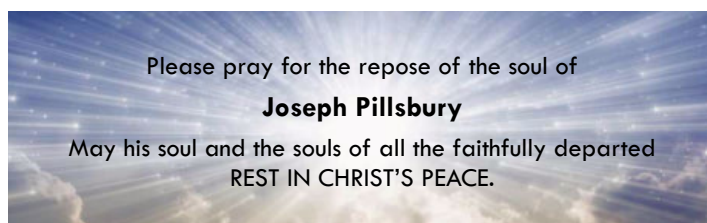

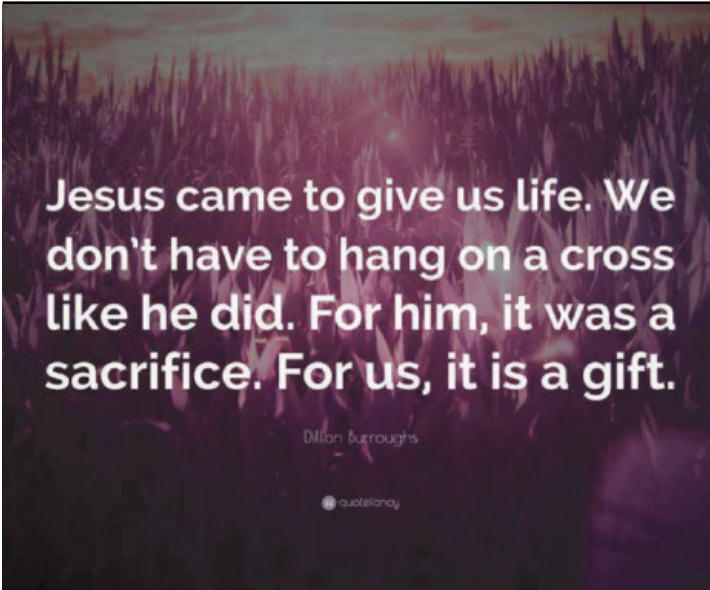

THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

5TH SUNDAY OF LENT

Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be when he made a dead person alive. We know of three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us.

The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed, and once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others.

What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive.

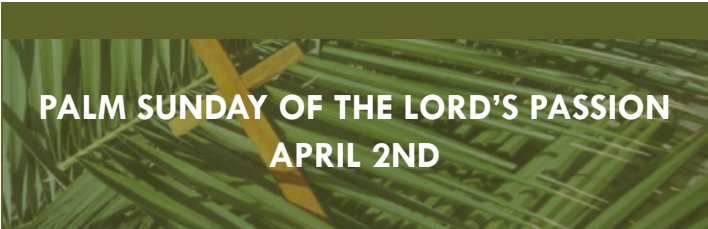

We ask for TWO people to commit to adoring our Lord for every scheduled hour each day. Visit the website to signup! All are invited to come and spend some quiet time in prayer in the presence of Our Lord.



At Palm Sunday Mass, we start by singing, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" echoing the joyful shouts that welcomed Christ into Jerusalem. Later in the Mass, we recall Christ's suffering and death. No other Sunday in the liturgical year takes us from such an emotional high to the depths of pain and grief. It is the start of Holy Week.

At the 11:00 am Mass, all parishioners are invited to gather at the west doors by the gym. Father Ken will be wearing red. We will hear the introductory prayers, have our palms blessed, and hear the Processional Gospel. If the weather is good, we will process up the sidewalk and enter through the Borromeo Room. If the weather is less than ideal, we will process through the school. At all other Masses, this action takes place in the back of the church, and there is a simple procession. We will wave our palms as the people of Jerusalem did and sing "All Glory, Laud and Honor."

As we enter church, we see that the cross is covered. It will remain covered until Good Friday. The scripture readings draw us into the mystery of Christ's suffering. We pray the beautiful Psalm 22: "My God, My God, Why Have You Abandoned Me?" During the Gospel, we take part in proclaiming the Passion of our Lord. We hear the crowd yell "We want Barabbas!" and "Crucify him!", and we reverently kneel as we hear that Jesus breathed his last. At Offertory, we sing "O Sacred Head" and later the Communion antiphon "Father If This Chalice Cannot Pass." At the end of Mass, we depart in solemn silence.

As we relive this mystery of Christ's suffering and death, there are many feelings to unpack. The Son of God rode into Jerusalem in triumph and is now preparing to die. How will you and your family keep vigil this week? How can you talk with your children about sacrifice, giving, and forgiving? As we enter into this holiest of weeks, may our participation in each liturgy draw us deeper into union with Christ and with one another.
